1 AN ACT Relating to the establishment of a telecommunications and 2 information industries development office; adding a new section to 3 chapter 43.330 RCW; creating a new section; and making an 4 appropriation.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. The legislature finds that:

7 (1) Telecommunications and information industries are a major source of economic growth nationally and in the state of Washington. 8 It finds that more than half of the labor force in the United States is 9 10 in telecommunications and information-related jobs and that, in Washington, employment in these sectors of the economy outpaces most 11 12 others. It further finds that, in Washington, telecommunications and 13 information industries offer significant employment opportunities that 14 help offset job losses in other industries;

(2) Many other states are actively working to develop and promote their advanced telecommunications and information industries, thereby attracting new and existing businesses that might otherwise locate, relocate, or remain in Washington; and 1 (3) State government must work to ensure competitiveness with other 2 states in developing the telecommunications and information industries, 3 in attracting new business to Washington, and in addressing the needs 4 of existing telecommunications and information businesses in the state 5 of Washington.

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 43.330 RCW 7 to read as follows:

8 There is created within the department the Washington 9 telecommunications and information industries development office to promote development of the telecommunications and 10 information industries in Washington. In administering the office, the director 11 12 shall:

(1) Implement a strategy to attract new businesses and investment in the telecommunications and information industries to Washington and to create new business opportunities for Washington companies in those industries;

17 (2) Act as a liaison for telecommunications and information 18 businesses seeking to locate or relocate in Washington by facilitating 19 access to information about the state, its laws and rules, local laws 20 and regulations, and available telecommunications infrastructure or 21 services;

(3) Work with institutions of postsecondary education, including 22 23 community and technical colleges, to ensure the availability of degree 24 and nondegree programs to provide training necessary for high-25 technology jobs in the telecommunications and information industries; 26 (4) Conduct studies on matters affecting the health and development 27 of the telecommunications and information industries, including but not limited to matters concerning development in rural areas, employment 28 29 and training needs, and geographic or economic trends within the 30 industries; and

(5) Submit an annual report, by December 31, to the legislatureoutlining the progress in implementing this chapter.

33 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. The sum of . . . hundred thousand dollars, 34 or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the 35 biennium ending June 30, 1997, from the public service revolving fund
