- 1 AN ACT Relating to community and technical college tuition refunds
- 2 or fee cancellations; amending RCW 28B.15.600; adding a new section to
- 3 chapter 28B.15 RCW; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28B.15.600 and 1993 sp.s. c 18 s 22 are each amended 6 to read as follows:
- 7 The governing boards of the state universities, the regional
- 8 universities, and The Evergreen State College((, and the community
- 9 colleges)) may refund or cancel in full the tuition and services and
- 10 activities fees if the student withdraws from a university or college
- 11 course or program prior to the sixth day of instruction of the quarter
- 12 or semester for which the fees have been paid or are due. If the
- 13 student withdraws on or after the sixth day of instruction, the
- 14 governing boards may refund or cancel up to one-half of the fees,
- 15 provided such withdrawal occurs within the first thirty calendar days
- 16 following the beginning of instruction. However, if a different policy
- 17 is required by federal law in order for the institution of higher
- 18 education to maintain eligibility for federal funding of programs, the
- 19 governing board may adopt a refund policy that meets the minimum

requirements of the federal law, and the policy may treat all students 1 2 attending the institution in the same manner.

3 boards of the governing respective universities 4 college((s)) may adopt rules for the refund of tuition and fees for 5 courses or programs that begin after the start of the regular quarter or semester. The governing boards may adopt rules to comply with RCW 6 7 28B.15.623 and may extend the refund or cancellation period for 8 students who withdraw for medical reasons or who are called into the 9 military service of the United States and may refund other fees 10 pursuant to such rules as they may prescribe.

11 NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 28B.15 RCW 12 to read as follows:

- (1) The governing boards of the community colleges and technical 13 14 colleges shall refund or cancel up to one hundred percent but no less 15 than eighty percent of the tuition and services and activities fees if the student withdraws from a college course or program before the sixth day of instruction of the regular quarter for which the fees have been 17 18 paid or are due. If the student withdraws on or after the sixth day of 19 instruction, the governing boards shall refund or cancel up to fifty percent but no less than forty percent of the fees provided such 20 withdrawal occurs within the first twenty calendar days following the 21 beginning of instruction. However, if a different policy is required 22 23 by federal law in order for the college to maintain eligibility for 24 federal funding of programs, the governing board may adopt a refund 25 policy that meets the minimum requirements of the federal law and the policy may treat all students attending the institution in the same manner.
 - (2) The governing boards of the respective community college or technical college shall adopt rules consistent with subsection (1) of this section for the refund of tuition and fees for the summer quarter and for courses or programs that begin after the start of the regular quarter.
- (3) The governing boards of community colleges and technical 33 34 colleges may adopt rules to comply with RCW 28B.15.623 and may extend the refund or cancellation period for students who withdraw for medical 35 36 reasons or who are called into the military service of the United 37 States.
