## SENATE BILL 6314

1 AN ACT Relating to higher education tuition fees; amending RCW 2 28B.15.067; and adding a new section to chapter 28B.15 RCW.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 28B.15 RCW 5 to read as follows:

6 The legislature finds that, as a partner in financing public higher 7 education with students and parents who pay tuition and fees, it is important to provide predictability in state support and tuition rates 8 as well as affordability for both taxpayers and students. 9 То 10 accomplish predictability and affordability in tuition rates, the legislature intends that annual changes in tuition rates be based on 11 the average per capita income in the state, as predicted by the office 12 13 of economic and revenue forecast. It is the policy of the state that 14 general tax support for public postsecondary instruction also change in 15 accordance with the forecast of the state's average per capita income.

16 **Sec. 2.** RCW 28B.15.067 and 1995 1st sp.s. c 9 s 4 are each amended 17 to read as follows:

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1 (1) Tuition fees shall be established <u>and adjusted annually</u> under 2 the provisions of this chapter <u>beginning with the 1997-98 academic</u> 3 year. Such fees shall be identical, subject to other provisions of 4 this chapter, for students enrolled at either state university, for 5 <u>students enrolled at the regional universities and The Evergreen State</u> 6 <u>College, and for students enrolled at any community college</u>.

7 (2) Academic year tuition for full-time students at the state's
8 institutions of higher education for the 1995-96 academic year, other
9 than the summer term, shall be as provided in this subsection.

10 (a) At the University of Washington and Washington State 11 University:

(i) For resident undergraduate students and other resident students
not in graduate study programs or enrolled in programs leading to the
degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of
veterinary medicine, two thousand seven hundred sixty-four dollars;

16 (ii) For nonresident undergraduate students and other nonresident 17 students not in graduate study programs or enrolled in programs leading 18 to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and 19 doctor of veterinary medicine, eight thousand two hundred sixty-eight 20 dollars;

(iii) For resident graduate and law students not enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, four thousand four hundred ninety dollars;

(iv) For nonresident graduate and law students not enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, eleven thousand six hundred thirty-four dollars;

(v) For resident students enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, seven thousand four hundred ninety-seven dollars; and

(vi) For nonresident students enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, nineteen thousand four hundred thirty-one dollars. (b) At the regional universities and The Evergreen State College: (i) For resident undergraduate and all other resident students not in graduate study programs, two thousand forty-five dollars;

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(ii) For nonresident undergraduate and all other nonresident
 students not in graduate study programs, seven thousand nine hundred
 ninety-two dollars;

4 (iii) For resident graduate students, three thousand four hundred 5 forty-three dollars; and

6 (iv) For nonresident graduate students, eleven thousand seventy-one7 dollars.

8 (c) At the community colleges:

9 (i) For resident students, one thousand two hundred twelve dollars; 10 and

(ii) For nonresident students, five thousand one hundred sixty-twodollars and fifty cents.

(3) Academic year tuition for full-time students at the state's institutions of higher education beginning with the 1996-97 academic year, other than the summer term, shall be as provided in this subsection.

17 (a) At the University of Washington and Washington State 18 University:

19 (i) For resident undergraduate students and other resident students 20 not in graduate study programs or enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of 21 22 veterinary medicine, two thousand eight hundred seventy-five dollars; 23 (ii) For nonresident undergraduate students and other nonresident 24 students not in graduate study programs or enrolled in programs leading 25 to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and 26 doctor of veterinary medicine, eight thousand five hundred ninety-nine 27 dollars;

(iii) For resident graduate and law students not enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, four thousand six hundred sixty-nine dollars;

(iv) For nonresident graduate and law students not enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, twelve thousand one hundred dollars;

36 (v) For resident students enrolled in programs leading to the 37 degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of 38 veterinary medicine, seven thousand seven hundred ninety-seven dollars; 39 and (vi) For nonresident students enrolled in programs leading to the
 degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of
 veterinary medicine, twenty thousand two hundred nine dollars.

4 (b) At the regional universities and The Evergreen State College:
5 (i) For resident undergraduate and all other resident students not
6 in graduate study programs, two thousand one hundred twenty-seven
7 dollars;

8 (ii) For nonresident undergraduate and all other nonresident 9 students not in graduate study programs, eight thousand three hundred 10 twelve dollars;

(iii) For resident graduate students, three thousand five hundredeighty-one dollars; and

13 (iv) For nonresident graduate students, eleven thousand five 14 hundred fourteen dollars.

15 (c) At the community colleges:

16 (i) For resident students, one thousand two hundred sixty-one 17 dollars; and

18 (ii) For nonresident students, five thousand three hundred sixty-19 nine dollars and fifty cents.

20 (4) For the 1997-98 academic year and thereafter, the tuition fee rates specified in subsection (3) of this section shall be adjusted to 21 reflect the forecasted annual change in state personal per capita 22 income. Annually by December 15th, the higher education coordinating 23 24 board shall calculate tuition fee rates for the following academic year and forecast the tuition fee rates for the next succeeding academic 25 year, based on the forecasted annual percentage change in state 26 personal per capita income during the fiscal year in which the academic 27 year begins, as determined by the economic and revenue forecast council 28 under chapter 82.33 RCW. 29

30 (5) The tuition fees established under this chapter shall not apply 31 to high school students enrolling in community colleges under RCW 32 28A.600.300 through 28A.600.395.

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
