- (g) Iron Horse/Bandera, King county, to the state parks and recreation commission for state park purposes;
- (h) Kitsap Forest, Kitsap county, to the department of natural resources for natural area preserve purposes; and
- (i) Mount Peak, King county, to King county for open space and recreation purposes.
- (3) Property transferred under this section shall be appraised and transferred at fair market value. For purposes of this appropriation, notwithstanding RCW 43.51.270, 79.01.009, or 79.71.050, chapter 79.70 RCW, or other conflicting statutes, the value of the timber transferred shall be deposited by the department of natural resources in the same manner as timber revenues from other common school trust lands. No

Authorized costs include the actual cost of appraisals, staff time, environmental reviews, surveys and other similar costs.
- (5) The department of natural resources shall attempt to maintain an aggregate ratio of 85:15 timber-to-land value in these transactions.
- (6) Intergrant exchanges between common school and other trust lands of equal value may occur if the exchange is in the interest of each trust, as determined by the board of natural resources.
- (7) Prior to or concurrent with conveyance of these properties, the department of natural resources, with full cooperation of the receiving agencies, shall execute and record a real property instrument which dedicates the transferred properties to the purposes identified in subsection (2) of this section for a minimum period of twenty years. The department of natural resources, in consultation with the receiving agencies, shall develop policy to address requests to replace transferred properties subject to the recorded property instrument that are no longer deemed appropriate for the purposes identified in subsection (2) of this section.
- (8) The department of natural resources and receiving agencies shall work in good faith to carry out the intent of this section. However, the department of natural resources or receiving agencies may remove a property from the transfer list in subsection (2) of this section if, based on new substantive information, it is determined transfer of said property is not in the statewide interest of either the common school trust or the receiving agency.

The facility will be financed 9 through contributions from consortium members and a grant from the 10 Federal Aviation Administration which requires annual training for all 11 public and private airport fire fighters. No state appropriations are 12 provided. The consortium will pay for the cost of the project 13 estimated \$8,000,000.
