- 1 AN ACT Relating to state workers' salaries that are more than
- 2 twenty-five percent behind the prevailing rates for their job classes;
- 3 and creating new sections.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The department of personnel conducts a
- 6 biennial salary survey of state workers. That survey indicates that
- 7 several thousand state employees are significantly behind their
- 8 counterparts in the private sector and other public sector
- 9 jurisdictions.
- 10 It is the intent of this act to raise the salaries of all state
- 11 workers who are more than twenty-five percent behind the prevailing
- 12 rates for their job classes to salaries that are no more than
- 13 twenty-five percent behind the prevailing rates.
- 14 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** No later than June 30, 1997, the salaries of
- 15 state workers in job classes that are thirty percent behind the
- 16 prevailing rates for those job classes, as listed on the survey
- 17 published in June 1995 by the senate committee on ways and means, shall

- 1 be raised to a level that is no more than twenty-five percent behind
- 2 the prevailing rates for those job classes.
