## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 8430

State of Washington 54th Legislature 1996 Regular Session

WHEREAS, The Legislature established a comprehensive state-wide
emergency medical care system in 1990; and

3 WHEREAS, Trauma care is an essential and beneficial component of 4 the emergency medical care system; and

5 WHEREAS, Increasing pressure and demands are being placed upon the 6 trauma care system state-wide; and

7 WHEREAS, Standards for facility, equipment, and personnel for 8 trauma care and pediatric trauma care were established by September 9 1990 pursuant to state law; and

10 WHEREAS, By July 1993, the department of health was authorized to 11 designate hospitals and health care facilities to provide designated 12 trauma care services; and

13 WHEREAS, There is a lack of financial resources to meet the needs 14 of the trauma care system, which has never been properly funded;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the Senate of the state of Washington, the House of Representatives concurring, That the department of health shall conduct or cause to be conducted a study on all costs, charges, expenses, and levels of reimbursement associated with providers of designated trauma care services; and

20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the department of health prepare a 21 report that includes recommendations for reimbursement of

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1 undercompensated and uncompensated trauma care at designated trauma

- 2 care facilities state-wide. This report shall be submitted to the
- 3 appropriate committees of the legislature by July 1, 1997.

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
