1 TO THE HONORABLE BILL CLINTON, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, AND 2 TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF 3 REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 4 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED:

5 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of 6 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully 7 represent and petition as follows:

8 WHEREAS, The State of Washington in the United States of America 9 and Taiwan have an extensive cultural, economic, and political 10 relationship; and

11 WHEREAS, Taiwan has been a strong trading partner of the United 12 States and of the State of Washington, with over five billion dollars 13 in trade between Taiwan and the State of Washington annually; and

14 WHEREAS, The State of Washington has chosen to recognize the 15 importance of its relationship with Taiwan by establishing a Trade 16 Office in Taipei; and

WHEREAS, A democratic, multiparty political system has beensmoothly established in Taiwan in recent years; and

19 WHEREAS, The direct role of Taiwan in international development 20 programs and humanitarian relief operations has expanded significantly

1 during the past decade, often in close coordination with our nation's
2 efforts;

3 NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that the United 4 States give due consideration to its beneficial commercial relationship with the people of Taiwan and to Taiwan's record of democratization at 5 home and humanitarian service abroad. Your memorialists further pray 6 7 that the United States treat the President of Taiwan and other Taiwan 8 public officials with the respect and consideration afforded to 9 representatives of other democratic nations and, further, that the 10 United States recognize the readiness of Taiwan to further contribute through broader participation in the international community, including 11 the United Nations and such forums as multilateral trade associations 12 and humanitarian relief organizations. 13

BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately transmitted to the Honorable Bill Clinton, President of the United States, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and each member of Congress from the State of Washington.
