1 TO THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION:

2 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of
3 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
4 represent and petition as follows:

5 WHEREAS, Senator James T. Matson has served the people of the
6 Yakima Valley and the State of Washington with distinction during his
7 sixteen-year tenure in the Legislature; and

8 WHEREAS, Senator Matson is known and respected for his legislative
9 knowledge and political instincts; and

10 WHEREAS, Senator Matson has displayed his leadership skills,
11 whether serving as Senate Minority Leader of the Senate Republican
12 Caucus or, most recently, as Chairman of the Senate's Committee on
13 Labor and Commerce; and

14 WHEREAS, Senator Matson's penchant for straight talk and reputation
15 as one who does not go back on his word was refreshing during these
16 times of political rhetoric and double talk; and

17 WHEREAS, Senator Matson has been a powerful ally and promoter for
18 the state's agricultural industry, fighting for right-to-farm laws and
19 reducing unnecessary government red tape; and

20 WHEREAS, Senator Matson has supported efforts to give police and
21 investigators the necessary tools to fight drugs and crime; and

1 WHEREAS, Most notably, Senator Matson distinguished himself as a
2 taxpayer advocate, leading the way for smaller, leaner state
3 government; and

4 WHEREAS, Throughout his legislative career, Senator Matson fought
5 hard to keep government off the backs of businesses, farmers, and
6 citizens; and

7 WHEREAS, Senator Matson has been a strong supporter of the Yakima
8 Valley, evident in such projects as the rebuilding of the Clear Creek
9 Dam; and

10 WHEREAS, Opinion leaders have called Jim "one of the best
11 legislators this past quarter century," " . . . one of the most highly
12 respected, intelligent and independent-minded lawmakers in Olympia,"
13 describing him with words such as "honesty," "integrity," and
14 "commitment"; and

16 class work for the Senate and the people who elected him and,
17 throughout his years of service, Senator Matson never let either of
18 them down;
