- 1 AN ACT Relating to promoting the recycled content of products and
- 2 buildings; amending RCW 43.19A.020, 43.19A.050, 43.78.170, and
- 3 47.28.220; adding new sections to chapter 39.04 RCW; and repealing RCW
- 4 43.19A.090 and 43.19A.100.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 **Sec. 1.** RCW 43.19A.020 and 1995 c 269 s 1406 are each amended to 7 read as follows:
- 8 (1) ((The director shall adopt standards specifying the minimum
- 9 content of recycled materials in products or product categories. The
- 10 standards shall:
- 11 (a) Be consistent with the USEPA product standards)) The USEPA
- 12 product standards, as now or hereafter amended, are adopted as the
- 13 minimum standards for the state of Washington. These standards shall
- 14 be implemented for at least the products listed in (a) and (b) of this
- 15 <u>subsection</u> by the <u>dates</u> indicated, unless the director finds that a
- 16 different standard would significantly increase recycled product
- 17 availability or competition((+
- 18 (b) Consider the standards of other states, to encourage
- 19 consistency of manufacturing standards;

- 1 (c) Consider regional product manufacturing capability;
- 2 (d) Address specific products or classes of products; and
- 3 (e) Consider postconsumer waste content and the recyclability of the product.
- 5 (2) The director shall consult with the department of ecology prior 6 to adopting the recycled content standards.
- 7 (3) The director shall adopt recycled content standards for at 8 least the following products by the dates indicated:)).
- 9 (a) By July 1,  $((\frac{1992}{}))$   $\underline{1997}$ :
- 10 (i) Paper and paper products;
- 11 (ii) Organic recovered materials; and
- 12 (iii) Latex paint products;
- 13 (b) By July 1, ((<del>1993</del>)) <u>1997</u>:
- 14 (i) Products for lower value uses containing recycled plastics;
- 15 (ii) Retread and remanufactured tires;
- 16 (iii) Lubricating oils;
- 17 (iv) Automotive batteries; ((and))
- 18 (v) Building insulation:
- 19 <u>(vi) Panelboard; and</u>
- 20 (vii) Compost products.
- $((\frac{4}{1}))$  (2) The standards required by this section shall be applied
- 22 to recycled product purchasing by the department and other state
- 23 agencies. The standards may be adopted or applied by any other local
- 24 government in product procurement. The standards shall provide for
- 25 exceptions under appropriate circumstances to allow purchases of
- 26 recycled products that do not meet the minimum content requirements of
- 27 the standards.
- 28 **Sec. 2.** RCW 43.19A.050 and 1991 c 297 s 7 are each amended to read
- 29 as follows:
- The department shall prepare a ((mandatory state plan)) strategy to
- 31 increase purchases of recycled-content products by the department and
- 32 all state agencies, including higher education institutions. The
- 33 ((plan)) strategy shall include purchases from public works contracts.
- 34 The ((<del>plan</del>)) <u>strategy</u> shall address the purchase of plastic products,
- 35 retread and remanufactured tires, motor vehicle lubricants, latex
- 36 paint, and lead acid batteries having recycled content. In addition,
- 37 the ((plan)) strategy shall incorporate actions to achieve the

- 1 following purchase level goals of recycled content paper and compost 2 products:
- 3 (1) Paper products as a percentage of the total dollar amount 4 purchased on an annual basis:
- 5 (a) At least ((forty)) sixty percent by ((1993)) 1996;
- 6 (b) At least ((fifty)) seventy percent by ((1994)) 1997;
- 7 (c) At least ((sixty)) eighty percent by ((1995)) 1998.
- 8 (2) Compost products as a percentage of the total dollar amount on 9 an annual basis:
- 10 (a) At least ((twenty-five)) forty percent by ((1993)) 1996;
- 11 (b) At least ((forty)) sixty percent by ((1995)) 1997;
- 12 (c) At least ((sixty)) eighty percent by ((1997)) 1998.
- 13 **Sec. 3.** RCW 43.78.170 and 1991 c 297 s 10 are each amended to read 14 as follows:
- 15 The public printer shall take all actions consistent with the plan
- 16 under RCW 43.19A.050 to ensure that seventy-five percent or more of the
- 17 total dollar amount of printing paper stock used by the printer is
- 18 recycled content paper by January 1, ((1995)) 1997, and ninety percent
- 19 or more of the total dollar amount of printing paper stock used by the
- 20 printer is recycled content paper by January 1, 1999.
- 21 **Sec. 4.** RCW 47.28.220 and 1992 c 174 s 14 are each amended to read 22 as follows:
- 23 (1) A contract awarded in whole or in part for the purchase of 24 compost products as a soil cover or soil amendment to state highway
- 25 rights of way shall specify that compost products be purchased in
- 26 accordance with the following schedule:
- 27 (a) For the period July 1,  $((\frac{1991}{1}))$   $\frac{1996}{1}$ , through June 30,  $((\frac{1993}{1}))$
- 28 1997, twenty-five percent of the total dollar amount purchased;
- 29 (b) For the period July 1,  $((\frac{1993}{1998}))$  1998, through June 30,  $((\frac{1995}{1998}))$
- 30 1999, fifty percent of the total dollar amount purchased. The
- 31 percentages in this subsection apply ((only)) to the materials'
- 32 value( $(\frac{1}{2})$ ) and  $((\frac{do not}{do not}))$  include services or other materials.
- 33 (2) In order to carry out the provisions of this section, the
- 34 department of transportation shall develop and adopt bid specifications
- 35 for compost products used in state highway construction projects.
- 36 (3)(a) For purposes of this section, "compost products" means
- 37 mulch, soil amendments, ground cover, or other landscaping material

- 1 derived from the biological or mechanical conversion of biosolids or
- 2 cellulose-containing waste materials.
- 3 (b) For purposes of this section, "biosolids" means municipal
- 4 sewage sludge or septic tank septage sludge that meets the requirements
- 5 of chapter 70.95J RCW.
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** A new section is added to chapter 39.04 RCW
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (1) The state's preferences for the purchase and use of recycled-
- 9 content products shall be included as a factor in the design and
- 10 development of state capital improvement projects.
- 11 (2) Specifications for materials in state construction projects
- 12 shall include the use of recycled-content products and recyclable
- 13 products whenever practicable.
- 14 (3) This section does not apply to contracts entered into by a
- 15 municipality.
- 16 NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. A new section is added to chapter 39.04 RCW
- 17 to read as follows:
- 18 Material from demolition projects shall be recycled or reused
- 19 whenever practicable.
- 20 <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **Sec. 7.** The following acts or parts of acts are each
- 21 repealed:
- 22 (1) RCW 43.19A.090 and 1991 c 297 s 12; and
- 23 (2) RCW 43.19A.100 and 1991 c 297 s 13.
