- 1 AN ACT Relating to farm vehicle exceptions to commercial driver's
- 2 license requirements; and amending RCW 46.25.050.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.25.050 and 1990 c 56 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) Drivers of commercial motor vehicles shall obtain a commercial
- 7 driver's license as required under this chapter by April 1, 1992. The
- 8 director shall establish a program to convert all qualified commercial
- 9 motor vehicle drivers by that date. After April 1, 1992, except when
- 10 driving under a commercial driver's instruction permit and a valid
- 11 automobile or classified license and accompanied by the holder of a
- 12 commercial driver's license valid for the vehicle being driven, no
- 13 person may drive a commercial motor vehicle unless the person holds and
- 14 is in immediate possession of a commercial driver's license and
- 15 applicable endorsements valid for the vehicle they are driving.
- 16 However, this requirement does not apply to any person:
- 17 (a) Who is the operator of a farm vehicle, and the vehicle is:
- 18 (i) Controlled and operated by a farmer;

- 1 (ii) Used to transport either agricultural products, which in this
 2 section include Christmas trees and wood products harvested from
 3 private tree farms and transported by vehicles weighing no more than
 4 forty thousand pounds licensed gross vehicle weight, farm machinery,
 5 farm supplies, or any combination of those materials to or from a farm;
- 6 (iii) Not used in the operations of a common or contract motor 7 carrier; and
 - (iv) Used within one hundred fifty miles of the person's farm; or
- 9 (b) Who is a fire fighter or law enforcement officer operating 10 emergency equipment, and:
- 11 (i) The fire fighter or law enforcement officer has successfully 12 completed a driver training course approved by the director; and
- (ii) The fire fighter or law enforcement officer carries a certificate attesting to the successful completion of the approved training course; or
- 16 (c) Who is operating a recreational vehicle for noncommercial purposes. As used in this section, "recreational vehicle" includes a vehicle towing a horse trailer for a noncommercial purpose.
- 19 (2) No person may drive a commercial motor vehicle while his or her 20 driving privilege is suspended, revoked, or canceled, while subject to 21 disqualification, or in violation of an out-of-service order. 22 Violations of this subsection shall be punished in the same way as 23 violations of RCW 46.20.342(1).
