1 AN ACT Relating to higher education fiscal matters; and amending
2 RCW 28B.15.067.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28B.15.067 and 1995 1st sp.s. c 9 s 4 are each amended
5 to read as follows:

6 (1) Tuition fees shall be established under the provisions of this
7 chapter.

8 (2) Academic year tuition for full-time students at the state's
9 institutions of higher education for the 1995-96 academic year, other
10 than the summer term, shall be as provided in this subsection.

11 (a) At the University of Washington and Washington State
12 University:

13 (i) For resident undergraduate students and other resident students
14 not in graduate study programs or enrolled in programs leading to the
15 degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of
16 veterinary medicine, two thousand seven hundred sixty-four dollars;

17 (ii) For nonresident undergraduate students and other nonresident
18 students not in graduate study programs or enrolled in programs leading
19 to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and

1 doctor of veterinary medicine, eight thousand two hundred sixty-eight
2 dollars;

3 (iii) For resident graduate and law students not enrolled in
4 programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental
5 surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, four thousand four hundred
6 ninety dollars;

7 (iv) For nonresident graduate and law students not enrolled in
8 programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental
9 surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, eleven thousand six hundred
10 thirty-four dollars;

11 (v) For resident students enrolled in programs leading to the
12 degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of
13 veterinary medicine, seven thousand four hundred ninety-seven dollars;
14 and

15 (vi) For nonresident students enrolled in programs leading to the
16 degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of
17 veterinary medicine, nineteen thousand four hundred thirty-one dollars.

18 (b) At the regional universities and The Evergreen State College:

19 (i) For resident undergraduate and all other resident students not
20 in graduate study programs, two thousand forty-five dollars;

21 (ii) For nonresident undergraduate and all other nonresident
22 students not in graduate study programs, seven thousand nine hundred
23 ninety-two dollars;

24 (iii) For resident graduate students, three thousand four hundred
25 forty-three dollars; and

26 (iv) For nonresident graduate students, eleven thousand seventy-one
27 dollars.

28 (c) At the community colleges:

29 (i) For resident students, one thousand two hundred twelve dollars;
30 and

31 (ii) For nonresident students, five thousand one hundred sixty-two
32 dollars and fifty cents.

33 (3) Academic year tuition for full-time students at the state's
34 institutions of higher education beginning with the 1996-97 academic
35 year, other than the summer term, shall be as provided in this
36 subsection.

37 (a) At the University of Washington and Washington State
38 University:

1 (i) For resident undergraduate students and other resident students
2 not in graduate study programs or enrolled in programs leading to the
3 degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of
4 veterinary medicine, two thousand eight hundred seventy-five dollars;

5 (ii) For nonresident undergraduate students and other nonresident
6 students not in graduate study programs or enrolled in programs leading
7 to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and
8 doctor of veterinary medicine, (~~eight thousand five hundred ninety-~~
9 ~~nine~~) nine thousand four hundred ninety-one dollars;

10 (iii) For resident graduate and law students not enrolled in
11 programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental
12 surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, four thousand six hundred
13 sixty-nine dollars;

14 (iv) For nonresident graduate and law students not enrolled in
15 programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental
16 surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, twelve thousand one hundred
17 dollars;

18 (v) For resident students enrolled in programs leading to the
19 degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of
20 veterinary medicine, seven thousand seven hundred ninety-seven dollars;
21 and

22 (vi) For nonresident students enrolled in programs leading to the
23 degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of
24 veterinary medicine, twenty thousand two hundred nine dollars.

25 (b) At the regional universities and The Evergreen State College:

26 (i) For resident undergraduate and all other resident students not
27 in graduate study programs, two thousand one hundred twenty-seven
28 dollars;

29 (ii) For nonresident undergraduate and all other nonresident
30 students not in graduate study programs, eight thousand three hundred
31 twelve dollars;

32 (iii) For resident graduate students, three thousand five hundred
33 eighty-one dollars; and

34 (iv) For nonresident graduate students, eleven thousand five
35 hundred fourteen dollars.

36 (c) At the community colleges:

37 (i) For resident students, one thousand two hundred sixty-one
38 dollars; and

1 (ii) For nonresident students, five thousand three hundred sixty-
2 nine dollars and fifty cents.

3 (4) The tuition fees established under this chapter shall not apply
4 to high school students enrolling in community colleges under RCW
5 28A.600.300 through 28A.600.395.

6 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** If any provision of this act or its
7 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
8 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
9 persons or circumstances is not affected.
