- 1 AN ACT Relating to state board of education office staff; and
- 2 amending RCW 28A.305.110 and 28A.300.020.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28A.305.110 and 1990 c 33 s 265 are each amended to 5 read as follows:
- 6 The state board of education ((shall)) may appoint ((some person to
- 7 be ex officio secretary of said board who shall not be entitled to a
- 8 vote in its proceedings)) an executive director who shall also serve as
- 9 secretary of the board. The state board of education may also appoint
- 10 other state board office assistants and clerical persons to perform
- 11 duties in support of the activities of the state board and such other
- 12 <u>duties including duties involving supervision over matters pertaining</u>
- 13 to the public schools as the superintendent of public instruction may
- 14 <u>delegate to the state board</u>. The secretary shall keep a correct record
- 15 of board proceedings((, which shall be kept in the office of the
- 16 superintendent of public instruction. He or she shall also)) and, upon
- 17 request, furnish to ((interested school officials)) any person a copy
- 18 of such proceedings. The executive director, his or her confidential
- 19 secretary, and administrative assistants in the offices of the state

- 1 board of education and superintendent of public instruction designated
- 2 by the superintendent are exempt from civil service, together with
- 3 other staff as now or hereafter designated as exempt in accordance with
- 4 chapter 41.06 RCW.

5 **Sec. 2.** RCW 28A.300.020 and 1969 ex.s. c 223 s 28A.03.020 are each 6 amended to read as follows:

7 The superintendent of public instruction may appoint assistant superintendents of public instruction, a deputy superintendent of 8 9 public instruction, and may employ such other assistants and clerical help as are necessary to carry out the duties of the superintendent and 10 the state board of education. However, the superintendent shall employ 11 without undue delay the executive director of the state board of 12 education and other state board of education office assistants and 13 clerical help, appointed by the state board under RCW 28A.305.110, 14 whose positions are allotted and funded in accordance with moneys 15 appropriated exclusively for the operation of the state board of 16 education. The rate of compensation and termination of any such 17 18 executive director, state board office assistants, and clerical help shall be subject to the prior consent of the state board of education. 19 The assistant superintendents, deputy superintendent, and such other 20 21 officers and employees as are exempted from the provisions of chapter 22 41.06 RCW, shall serve at the pleasure of the superintendent or at the 23 pleasure of the superintendent and the state board of education as provided in this section. Expenditures by the superintendent of public 24 25 instruction for direct and indirect support of the state board of education are valid operational expenditures by and in behalf of the 26 office of the superintendent of public instruction. 27
