- 10 (1) The following are exempt from public inspection and copying:
- 11 (a) Personal information in any files maintained for students in 12 public schools, patients or clients of public institutions or public 13 health agencies, or welfare recipients.
- (b) Personal information in files maintained for employees, appointees, or elected officials of any public agency to the extent that disclosure would violate their right to privacy.
- (c) Information required of any taxpayer in connection with the assessment or collection of any tax if the disclosure of the information to other persons would (i) be prohibited to such persons by RCW 84.08.210, 82.32.330, 84.40.020, or 84.40.340 or (ii) violate the taxpayer's right to privacy or result in unfair competitive disadvantage to the taxpayer.
- (d) Specific intelligence information and specific investigative records compiled by investigative, law enforcement, and penology agencies, and state agencies vested with the responsibility to discipline members of any profession, the nondisclosure of which is essential to effective law enforcement or for the protection of any person's right to privacy.
- 29 (e) Information revealing the identity of persons who are witnesses 30 to or victims of crime or who file complaints with investigative, law enforcement, or penology agencies, other than the public disclosure 31 commission, if disclosure would endanger any person's life, physical 32 safety, or property. If at the time a complaint is filed the 33 34 complainant, victim or witness indicates a desire for disclosure or 35 nondisclosure, such desire shall govern. However, all complaints filed with the public disclosure commission about any elected official or 36

- 1 candidate for public office must be made in writing and signed by the 2 complainant under oath.
- 3 (f) Test questions, scoring keys, and other examination data used 4 to administer a license, employment, or academic examination.

- (h) Valuable formulae, designs, drawings, and research data obtained by any agency within five years of the request for disclosure when disclosure would produce private gain and public loss.

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- (i) Preliminary drafts, notes, recommendations, and intra-agency memorandums in which opinions are expressed or policies formulated or recommended except that a specific record shall not be exempt when publicly cited by an agency in connection with any agency action.
- (j) Records which are relevant to a controversy to which an agency is a party but which records would not be available to another party under the rules of pretrial discovery for causes pending in the superior courts.
- (k) Records, maps, or other information identifying the location of archaeological sites in order to avoid the looting or depredation of such sites.
- 26 (1) Any library record, the primary purpose of which is to maintain 27 control of library materials, or to gain access to information, which 28 discloses or could be used to disclose the identity of a library user.
- (m) Financial information supplied by or on behalf of a person, firm, or corporation for the purpose of qualifying to submit a bid or proposal for (i) a ferry system construction or repair contract as required by RCW 47.60.680 through 47.60.750 or (ii) highway construction or improvement as required by RCW 47.28.070.
- (n) Railroad company contracts filed prior to July 28, 1991, with the utilities and transportation commission under RCW 81.34.070, except that the summaries of the contracts are open to public inspection and copying as otherwise provided by this chapter.

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(mm) Proprietary financial and commercial information that the submitting entity, with review by the department of health, specifically identifies at the time it is submitted and that is provided to or obtained by the department of health in connection with an application for, or the supervision of, an antitrust exemption sought by the submitting entity under RCW 43.72.310. If a request for such information is received, the submitting entity must be notified of the request. Within ten business days of receipt of the notice, the submitting entity shall provide a written statement of the continuing need for confidentiality, which shall be provided to the requester. Upon receipt of such notice, the department of health shall continue to treat information designated under this section as exempt from disclosure. If the requester initiates an action to compel disclosure 38

1 under this chapter, the submitting entity must be joined as a party to 2 demonstrate the continuing need for confidentiality.

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- (nn) Records maintained by the board of industrial insurance appeals that are related to appeals of crime victims' compensation claims filed with the board under RCW 7.68.110.
- (00) The home addresses, telephone numbers, social security 6 numbers, and photographs of active or former state and local law 7 enforcement personnel, including correctional and correctional 8 9 probation officers, personnel of the department of social and health services whose duties include the investigation of abuse, neglect, 10 exploitation, fraud, theft, or other criminal activities, and personnel 11 of the department of revenue or local governments whose 12 responsibilities include revenue collection and enforcement or child 13 support enforcement; the home addresses, telephone numbers, social 14 security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses 15 and children of such personnel; and the names and locations of schools 16 and day care facilities attended by the children of such personnel. 17
  - (2) Except for information described in subsection (1)(c)(i) of this section and confidential income data exempted from public inspection pursuant to RCW 84.40.020, the exemptions of this section are inapplicable to the extent that information, the disclosure of which would violate personal privacy or vital governmental interests, can be deleted from the specific records sought. No exemption may be construed to permit the nondisclosure of statistical information not descriptive of any readily identifiable person or persons.
  - (3) Inspection or copying of any specific records exempt under the provisions of this section may be permitted if the superior court in the county in which the record is maintained finds, after a hearing with notice thereof to every person in interest and the agency, that the exemption of such records is clearly unnecessary to protect any individual's right of privacy or any vital governmental function.
- 32 (4) Agency responses refusing, in whole or in part, inspection of 33 any public record shall include a statement of the specific exemption 34 authorizing the withholding of the record (or part) and a brief 35 explanation of how the exemption applies to the record withheld.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 9A.46 RCW to read as follows:

- 1 (1) A person is guilty of invading the privacy of a criminal justice worker if the person publicizes personal information about (a) an active or former criminal justice worker with whom the person has 4 had contact within the scope of the criminal justice worker's employment or (b) the spouse or child of such a criminal justice worker.
- 7 (2) Invading the privacy of a criminal justice worker is a gross 8 misdemeanor.
  - (3) As used in this section:

- 10 (a) "Criminal justice worker" includes state and local law enforcement personnel, correctional officers, correctional probation 11 officers, personnel of the department of social and health services 12 13 whose duties include the investigation of abuse, neglect, exploitation, fraud, theft, or other criminal activities, and personnel of the 14 15 department of revenue or local governments whose responsibilities include revenue collection and 16 enforcement child or 17 enforcement;
- 18 (b) "Personal information" includes home addresses, telephone 19 numbers, social security numbers, and photographs. For children and 20 spouses of criminal justice workers, it also includes places of 21 employment. For children of criminal justice workers, it also includes 22 names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended.
- (c) "Publicize" means the communication or dissemination of 23 information to any one or more persons (i) orally, in person, or by 24 25 telephone, radio, or television; (ii) in a writing of any kind, 26 including without limitation a letter or memorandum, circular, poster, 27 handbill, newspaper or magazine article, or book; electronically, including by the use of recordings, computer networks, 28 bulletin boards, or other means of electronic storage and retrieval." 29
