## 2 <u>SSB 5768</u> - H COMM AMD **ADOPTED 4-10-97**

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- 5 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the 6 following:
- 7 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that the rate of
- 8 unemployment among persons with developmental disabilities is high due
- 9 to the limited employment opportunities available to disabled persons.
- 10 Given that persons with disabilities are capable of filling employment
- 11 positions in the general work force population, supported employment is
- 12 an effective way of integrating such individuals into the general work
- 13 force population. The creation of supported employment programs can
- 14 increase the types and availability of employment positions for persons
- 15 with developmental disabilities.
- 16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** Unless the context clearly requires
- 17 otherwise the definitions in this section apply throughout sections 3
- 18 through 5 of this act.
- 19 (1) "Developmental disability" means a disability as defined in RCW
- 20 71A.10.020.
- 21 (2) "Supported employment" means employment for individuals with
- 22 developmental disabilities who may require on-the-job training and
- 23 long-term support in order to fulfill their job duties successfully.
- 24 Supported employment offers the same wages and benefits as similar
- 25 nonsupported employment positions.
- 26 (3) "State agency" means any office, department, division, bureau,
- 27 board, commission, community college or institution of higher
- 28 education, or agency of the state of Washington.
- 29 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** State agencies are encouraged to participate
- 30 in supported employment activities. The department of social and
- 31 health services, in conjunction with the department of personnel and
- 32 the office of financial management, shall identify agencies that have
- 33 positions and funding conducive to implementing supported employment.
- 34 An agency may only participate in supported employment activities

- 1 pursuant to this section if the agency is able to operate the program 2 within its existing budget. These agencies shall:
- 3 (1) Designate a coordinator who will be responsible for information 4 and resource referral regarding the agency's supported employment 5 program. The coordinator shall serve as a liaison between the agency 6 and the department of personnel regarding supported employment;
- 7 (2) Submit an annual update to the department of social and health 8 services, the department of personnel, and the office of financial 9 management. The annual update shall include: A description of the 10 agency's supported employment efforts, the number of persons placed in supported employment positions, recommendations concerning expanding 11 the supported employment program to include people with mental 12 disabilities or other disabilities, and an overall evaluation of the 13 effectiveness of supported employment for the agency. 14
- <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** The department of social and health services 15 and the department of personnel shall, after consultation with 16 supported employment provider associations and other interested 17 18 parties, encourage, educate, and assist state agencies in implementing 19 supported employment programs. The department of personnel shall provide human resources technical assistance to agencies implementing 20 supported employment programs. The department of personnel shall make 21 available, upon request of the legislature, an annual report that 22 23 evaluates the overall progress of supported employment in state 24 government.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. The creation of supported employment positions under sections 3 and 4 of this act shall not count against an agency's allotted full-time equivalent employee positions. Supported employment programs are not intended to displace employees or abrogate any reduction-in-force rights.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. Sections 2 through 5 of this act are each added to chapter 41.04 RCW."

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
