14       The appropriations in this section are subject to the following  
15 conditions and limitations:

16       (1) \$254,000 of the fingerprint identification account  
17 appropriation is provided solely for an automated system that will  
18 facilitate the access of criminal history records remotely by computer  
19 or telephone for preemployment background checks and other non-law  
20 enforcement purposes. The agency shall submit an implementation status  
21 report to the office of financial management and the legislature by  
22 September 1, 1997.

23       (2) \$264,000 of the general fund--federal appropriation is provided  
24 solely for a feasibility study to develop a criminal investigation  
25 computer system. The study will report on the feasibility of  
26 developing a system that uses incident-based reporting as its  
27 foundation, consistent with FBI standards. The system will have the  
28 capability of connecting with local law enforcement jurisdictions as  
29 well as fire protection agencies conducting arson investigations. The  
30 study will report on the system requirements for incorporating case  
31 management, intelligence data, imaging, and geographic information.  
32 The system will also provide links to existing crime information  
33 databases such as WASIS and WACIC. The agency shall submit a copy of  
34 the proposed study workplan to the office of financial management and  
35 the department of information services for approval prior to  
36 expenditure. A final report shall be submitted to the appropriate  
37 committees of the legislature, the office of financial management, and  
38 the department of information services no later than June 30, 1998.

1       (3) \$10,000 of the general fund--state fiscal year 1998  
2 appropriation and \$10,000 of the general fund--state fiscal year 1998  
3 appropriation are provided solely for implementation of Second  
4 Substitute Senate Bill No. 5528 (background checks). If the bill is
