5 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the  
6 following:

7 "Sec. 1. RCW 77.32.380 and 1993 sp.s. c 2 s 77 are each amended to  
8 read as follows:

9 (1) Persons ((~~sixteen years of age or older~~)) who enter upon or use  
10 clearly identified department ((~~lands and~~)) improved access facilities  
11 ((~~are~~)) with a motor vehicle may be required to ((~~possess a~~  
12 conservation license or a hunting, fishing, trapping, or free license  
13 on their person while using the facilities)) display a current annual  
14 fish and wildlife lands vehicle use permit on the motor vehicle while  
15 within or while using an improved access facility. An "improved access  
16 facility" is a clearly identified area specifically created for motor  
17 vehicle parking, and includes any boat launch or boat ramp associated  
18 with the parking area, but does not include the department parking  
19 facilities at the Gorge Concert Center near George, Washington. The  
20 vehicle use permit is issued in the form of a decal. One decal shall  
21 be issued at no charge with each annual saltwater, freshwater,  
22 combination, small game hunting, big game hunting, and trapping license  
23 issued by the department. The annual fee for ((~~this license~~)) a fish  
24 and wildlife lands vehicle use permit, if purchased separately, is ten  
25 dollars ((~~annually~~)). A person to whom the department has issued a  
26 decal or who has purchased a vehicle use permit separately may purchase  
27 a decal from the department for each additional vehicle owned by the  
28 person at a cost of five dollars per decal upon a showing of proof to  
29 the department that the person owns the additional vehicle or vehicles.  
30 Revenue derived from the sale of fish and wildlife lands vehicle use  
31 permits shall be used solely for the stewardship and maintenance of  
32 department improved access facilities. Revenue derived from the sale  
33 of fish and wildlife lands vehicle use permits shall be used solely for  
34 the stewardship and maintenance of department improved access  
35 facilities.

1       (~~The spouse, all children under eighteen years of age, and guests~~  
2 ~~under eighteen years of age of the holder of a valid conservation~~  
3 ~~license may use department lands and access facilities when accompanied~~  
4 ~~by the license holder.~~)

5       Youth groups may use department (~~lands and game~~) improved access  
6 facilities without possessing a ((conservation license)) vehicle use  
7 permit when accompanied by a ((license)) vehicle use permit holder.

8       The department may accept contributions into the state wildlife  
9 fund for the sound stewardship of fish and wildlife. Contributors  
10 shall be known as "conservation patrons" and, for contributions of  
11 twenty dollars or more, shall receive a fish and wildlife lands vehicle  
12 use permit free of charge.

13       (~~The conservation license is nontransferable and must be validated~~  
14 ~~by the signature of the holder. Upon request of a wildlife agent or ex~~  
15 ~~officio wildlife agent a person using clearly identified department~~  
16 ~~lands shall exhibit the required license.~~)

17       (2) The decal must be affixed in a permanent manner to the motor  
18 vehicle before entering upon or using the motor vehicle on a department  
19 improved access facility, and must be displayed on the rear window of  
20 the motor vehicle, or, if the motor vehicle does not have a rear  
21 window, on the rear of the motor vehicle.

22       (3) Failure to display the fish and wildlife lands vehicle use  
23 permit if required by this section is an infraction under chapter 7.84  
24 RCW, and department employees are authorized to issue a notice of  
25 infraction to the registered owner of any motor vehicle entering upon  
26 or using a department improved access facility without such a decal.  
27 The penalty for failure to display or improper display of the decal is  
28 sixty-six dollars.

29       **Sec. 2.** RCW 77.12.170 and 1996 c 101 s 7 are each amended to read  
30 as follows:

31       (1) There is established in the state treasury the state wildlife  
32 fund which consists of moneys received from:

33       (a) Rentals or concessions of the department;

34       (b) The sale of real or personal property held for department  
35 purposes;

36       (c) The sale of licenses, permits, tags, stamps, and punchcards  
37 required by this title;

38       (d) Fees for informational materials published by the department;

1 (e) Fees for personalized vehicle license plates as provided in  
2 chapter 46.16 RCW;

3 (f) Articles or wildlife sold by the director under this title;

4 (g) Compensation for wildlife losses or contributions, gifts, or  
5 grants received under RCW 77.12.320 or 77.32.380;

6 (h) Excise tax on anadromous game fish collected under chapter  
7 82.27 RCW;

8 (i) The sale of personal property seized by the department for  
9 wildlife violations; and

10 (j) The department's share of revenues from auctions and raffles  
11 authorized by the commission.

12 (2) State and county officers receiving any moneys listed in  
13 subsection (1) of this section shall deposit them in the state treasury  
14 to be credited to the state wildlife fund.

15 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** This act takes effect January 1, 1999."

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19 On page 1, line 2 of the title, after "lands;" strike the remainder  
20 of the title and insert "amending RCW 77.32.380 and 77.12.170;  
21 prescribing penalties; and providing an effective date."

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
