BACKGROUND:

The Public Disclosur act requires tate gencies and local governments to make quarter by ports of their oblying ctivities bliem ployees or official restrict their oblying one more than four days in any three-month period and elected official to do "in-person oblying a renot required breporthes activities er the Public Disclosur ct, if the total expenditures of "nonpublic funds" for any lobbying urposedoes not exceed \$15 during three-month eriod.

The PublicDisclosuract prohibitshedirector indirects of publicfunds for lobbyingurposes. However, officerand employees may communicate with a legislator the requestof that legislatered, through proper channels may communicate requests for legislatization appropriations cessary for the efficient on ductof public businessor in the proper performance of their ficial duties.
