## **SB 5647**

As Passed Senate, March 14, 1997

**Title:** An act relating to building fee payments by community and technical colleges.

**Brief Description:** Requiring only collected building fees of community and technical colleges to be paid to the state treasury.

**Sponsors:** Senators Wood, Snyder, Swecker, Bauer, Zarelli, Winsley and Kohl; by request of State Board for Community and Technical Colleges.

**Background:** In Washington, tuition fees for students attending most public colleges and universities are made up of two components: building fees and operating fees. Building fees provide part of the funding for facility repairs, renovations, and construction.

Currently, the four-year institutions of higher education must contribute their building fees to the state treasury within 35 days from the collection of those fees. The two-year institutions must contribute their building fees to the state treasury within 35 days from the start of each quarter.

**Summary of Bill:** Within 35 days from the beginning of each quarter, all collected building fees from the community and technical colleges must be paid to the state treasury.

**Appropriation:** None.

**Fiscal Note:** Not requested.

**Effective Date:** Ninety days after adjournment of session in which bill is passed.

**Testimony For:** This is an audit issue. The institutions are required to remit money that they have not collected.

**Testimony Against:** None.
