Background: Washington State has a tradition of naming bridges after prominent Washington citizens. The Tacoma community and the Military Affairs Subcommittee would like to acknowledge the many accomplishments and contributions of Admiral James S. Russell, a Tacoma native, by naming the new cable stay bridge as it crosses the Thea Foss Waterway on State Route 509 the Admiral James S. Russell Bridge.—

The State Route 509 cable stay bridge is a modified suspension bridge that is approximately 1,000 feet in length. The Washington State Department of Transportation completed bridge construction in 1997.

Summary of Bill: The new cable stay bridge as it crosses the Thea Foss Waterway on State Route 509 is named the Admiral James S. Russell Bridge.—
