1 AN ACT Relating to privileged communications between certified 2 counselors and clients; amending RCW 18.19.180; and adding a new 3 section to chapter 18.19 RCW.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 18.19 RCW 6 to read as follows:

7 Confidential communications between a client and an individual 8 certified under this chapter are privileged against compulsory 9 disclosure to the same extent and subject to the same conditions as 10 confidential communications between a psychologist and client, but this 11 exception is subject to the limitations under RCW 70.96A.140.

12 **Sec. 2.** RCW 18.19.180 and 1991 c 3 s 33 are each amended to read 13 as follows:

An individual registered ((<del>or certified</del>)) under this chapter shall not disclose the written acknowledgment of the disclosure statement pursuant to RCW 18.19.060 nor any information acquired from persons consulting the individual in a professional capacity when that

1 information was necessary to enable the individual to render 2 professional services to those persons except:

3 (1) With the written consent of that person or, in the case of 4 death or disability, the person's personal representative, other person 5 authorized to sue, or the beneficiary of an insurance policy on the 6 person's life, health, or physical condition;

7 (2) That ((a person)) an individual registered ((or certified)) 8 under this chapter is not required to treat as confidential a 9 communication that reveals the contemplation or commission of a crime 10 or harmful act;

(3) If the person is a minor, and the information acquired by the ((person)) individual registered ((or certified)) under this chapter indicates that the minor was the victim or subject of a crime, the ((person)) individual registered ((or certified)) may testify fully upon any examination, trial, or other proceeding in which the commission of the crime is the subject of the inquiry;

(4) If the person waives the privilege by bringing charges against the ((person)) <u>individual</u> registered ((<del>or certified</del>)) under this chapter;

(5) In response to a subpoena from a court of law or the secretary.
The secretary may subpoena only records related to a complaint or
report under chapter 18.130 RCW; or

23 (6) As required under chapter 26.44 RCW.
