## HOUSE BILL 1460

State of Washington55th Legislature1997 Regular SessionBy Representatives Huff and Carlson

Read first time 01/28/97. Referred to Committee on Higher Education.

1 AN ACT Relating to higher education tuition; amending RCW 2 28B.15.067; adding a new section to chapter 28B.15 RCW; and creating a 3 new section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. Tuition rates currently charged for students 6 enrolled in programs leading to a first-professional law degree are 7 significantly below the average rates charged at comparable 8 institutions across the nation. It is the intent of the legislature to charge competitive tuition rates for first-professional law students. 9 10 Sections 2 and 3 of this act establish a six-year phase-in period to achieve competitive tuition rates for first-professional law students 11 12 with rates for those students at comparable institutions of higher education. 13

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 28B.15 RCW
 to read as follows:
 The higher education coordinating board shall maintain listings of

17 comparable institutions for each of the research universities.

1 sec. 3. RCW 28B.15.067 and 1996 c 212 s 1 are each amended to read 2 as follows:

3 (1) Tuition fees shall be established under the provisions of this4 chapter.

5 (2) Academic year tuition for full-time students at the state's 6 institutions of higher education for the 1995-96 academic year, other 7 than the summer term, shall be as provided in this subsection.

(iv) For nonresident graduate and law students not enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, eleven thousand six hundred thirty-four dollars;

(v) For resident students enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, seven thousand four hundred ninety-seven dollars; and

(vi) For nonresident students enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, nineteen thousand four hundred thirty-one dollars. (b) At the regional universities and The Evergreen State College: (i) For resident undergraduate and all other resident students not in graduate study programs, two thousand forty-five dollars;

37 (ii) For nonresident undergraduate and all other nonresident 38 students not in graduate study programs, seven thousand nine hundred 39 ninety-two dollars;

(iii) For resident graduate students, three thousand four hundred
 forty-three dollars; and

3 (iv) For nonresident graduate students, eleven thousand seventy-one4 dollars.

5 (c) At the community colleges:

6 (i) For resident students, one thousand two hundred twelve dollars;7 and

8 (ii) For nonresident students, five thousand one hundred sixty-two9 dollars and fifty cents.

10 (3) Academic year tuition for full-time students at the state's 11 institutions of higher education beginning with the 1996-97 academic 12 year, other than the summer term, shall be as provided in this 13 subsection.

14 (a) At the University of Washington and Washington State 15 University:

16 (i) For resident undergraduate students and other resident students 17 not in graduate study programs or enrolled in programs leading to the 18 degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of 19 veterinary medicine, two thousand eight hundred seventy-five dollars;

(ii) For nonresident undergraduate students and other nonresident students not in graduate study programs or enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, nine thousand four hundred ninety-one dollars;

(iii) For resident graduate and law students not enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, four thousand six hundred sixty-nine dollars;

(iv) For nonresident graduate and law students not enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, twelve thousand one hundred dollars;

33 (v) For resident students enrolled in programs leading to the 34 degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of 35 veterinary medicine, seven thousand seven hundred ninety-seven dollars; 36 and

(vi) For nonresident students enrolled in programs leading to the
 degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of
 veterinary medicine, twenty thousand two hundred nine dollars.

(b) At the regional universities and The Evergreen State College: 1 (i) For resident undergraduate and all other resident students not 2 3 in graduate study programs, two thousand one hundred twenty-seven 4 dollars; (ii) For nonresident undergraduate and all other nonresident 5 students not in graduate study programs, eight thousand three hundred б 7 twelve dollars; 8 (iii) For resident graduate students, three thousand five hundred 9 eighty-one dollars; and 10 (iv) For nonresident graduate students, eleven thousand five hundred fourteen dollars. 11 12 (c) At the community colleges: 13 (i) For resident students, one thousand two hundred sixty-one 14 dollars; and 15 (ii) For nonresident students, five thousand three hundred sixtynine dollars and fifty cents. 16 (4) Academic year tuition at the state's institutions of higher 17 education for full-time students enrolled in first-professional law 18 19 programs, other than the summer term, shall be as provided in this 20 subsection. (a) In academic year 1997-98: 21 (i) For resident students, five thousand three hundred ten dollars; 22 23 and 24 (ii) For nonresident students, thirteen thousand fifty dollars. 25 (b) In academic year 1998-99: (i) For resident students, five thousand nine hundred fifty-two 26 dollars; and 27 (ii) For nonresident students, fourteen thousand one dollars. 28 (c) In academic year 1999-2000: 29 30 (i) For resident students, six thousand five hundred ninety-four dollars; and 31 (ii) For nonresident students, fourteen thousand nine hundred 32 fifty-two dollars. 33 34 (d) In academic year 2000-01: 35 (i) For resident students, seven thousand two hundred thirty-six dollars; and 36 37 (ii) For nonresident students, fifteen thousand nine hundred three 38 dollars. 39 (e) In academic year 2001-02:

(i) For resident students, seven thousand eight hundred

10 <u>(5)</u> The tuition fees established under this chapter shall not apply 11 to high school students enrolling in community colleges under RCW 12 28A.600.300 through 28A.600.395.

13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. If any provision of this act or its 14 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the 15 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other 16 persons or circumstances is not affected.
