1 AN ACT Relating to higher education tuition; and amending RCW
2 28B.15.067.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28B.15.067 and 1996 c 212 s 1 are each amended to read
5 as follows:

6 (1) Tuition fees shall be established under the provisions of this
7 chapter.

8 (2) Academic year tuition for full-time students at the state's
9 institutions of higher education for the (~~1995-96~~) 1997-98 academic
10 year, other than the summer term, shall be as provided in this
11 subsection.

12 (a) At the University of Washington and Washington State
13 University:

14 (i) For resident undergraduate students and other resident students
15 not in graduate study programs or enrolled in programs leading to the
16 degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of
17 veterinary medicine, two thousand seven hundred sixty-four dollars;

18 (ii) For nonresident undergraduate students and other nonresident
19 students not in graduate study programs or enrolled in programs leading

1 to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and
2 doctor of veterinary medicine((7)):

3 (A) At the University of Washington, ten thousand two hundred
4 seventy-eight dollars; and

5 (B) At Washington State University, eight thousand two hundred
6 sixty-eight dollars;

7 (iii) For resident graduate and law students not enrolled in
8 programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental
9 surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, four thousand four hundred
10 ninety dollars;

11 (iv) For nonresident graduate and law students not enrolled in
12 programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental
13 surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, eleven thousand six hundred
14 thirty-four dollars;

15 (v) For resident students enrolled in programs leading to the
16 degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of
17 veterinary medicine, seven thousand four hundred ninety-seven dollars;
18 and

19 (vi) For nonresident students enrolled in programs leading to the
20 degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of
21 veterinary medicine, nineteen thousand four hundred thirty-one dollars.

22 (b) At the regional universities and The Evergreen State College:

23 (i) For resident undergraduate and all other resident students not
24 in graduate study programs, two thousand forty-five dollars;

25 (ii) For nonresident undergraduate and all other nonresident
26 students not in graduate study programs, seven thousand nine hundred
27 ninety-two dollars;

28 (iii) For resident graduate students, three thousand four hundred
29 forty-three dollars; and

30 (iv) For nonresident graduate students, eleven thousand seventy-one
31 dollars.

32 (c) At the community colleges:

33 (i) For resident students, one thousand two hundred twelve dollars;
34 and

35 (ii) For nonresident students, five thousand one hundred sixty-two
36 dollars and fifty cents.

37 (3) Academic year tuition for full-time students at the state's
38 institutions of higher education beginning with the ((1996-97)) 1998-99

1 academic year, other than the summer term, shall be as provided in this
2 subsection.

3 (a) At the University of Washington and Washington State
4 University:

5 (i) For resident undergraduate students and other resident students
6 not in graduate study programs or enrolled in programs leading to the
7 degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of
8 veterinary medicine, two thousand eight hundred seventy-five dollars;

9 (ii) For nonresident undergraduate students and other nonresident
10 students not in graduate study programs or enrolled in programs leading
11 to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and
12 doctor of veterinary medicine(~~(7)~~):

13 (A) At the University of Washington, eleven thousand one hundred
14 thirty dollars; and

15 (B) At Washington State University, nine thousand four hundred
16 ninety-one dollars;

17 (iii) For resident graduate and law students not enrolled in
18 programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental
19 surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, four thousand six hundred
20 sixty-nine dollars;

21 (iv) For nonresident graduate and law students not enrolled in
22 programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental
23 surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, twelve thousand one hundred
24 dollars;

25 (v) For resident students enrolled in programs leading to the
26 degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of
27 veterinary medicine, seven thousand seven hundred ninety-seven dollars;
28 and

29 (vi) For nonresident students enrolled in programs leading to the
30 degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of
31 veterinary medicine, twenty thousand two hundred nine dollars.

32 (b) At the regional universities and The Evergreen State College:

33 (i) For resident undergraduate and all other resident students not
34 in graduate study programs, two thousand one hundred twenty-seven
35 dollars;

36 (ii) For nonresident undergraduate and all other nonresident
37 students not in graduate study programs, eight thousand three hundred
38 twelve dollars;

1 (iii) For resident graduate students, three thousand five hundred
2 eighty-one dollars; and

3 (iv) For nonresident graduate students, eleven thousand five
4 hundred fourteen dollars.

5 (c) At the community colleges:

6 (i) For resident students, one thousand two hundred sixty-one
7 dollars; and

8 (ii) For nonresident students, five thousand three hundred sixty-
9 nine dollars and fifty cents.

10 (4) The tuition fees established under this chapter shall not apply
11 to high school students enrolling in community colleges under RCW
12 28A.600.300 through 28A.600.395.

13 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** If any provision of this act or its
14 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
15 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
16 persons or circumstances is not affected.
