AN ACT Relating to repealing the carbonated beverage tax; amending RCW 69.50.520; creating a new section; repealing RCW 82.64.010, 82.64.020, 82.64.030, 82.64.040, and 82.64.050; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The following acts or parts of acts are each б 7 repealed: (1) RCW 82.64.010 and 1994 sp.s. c 7 s 905, 1991 c 80 s 1, & 1989 8 9 c 271 s 505; 10 (2) RCW 82.64.020 and 1994 sp.s. c 7 s 906, 1991 c 80 s 2, & 1989 11 c 271 s 506; 12 (3) RCW 82.64.030 and 1994 sp.s. c 7 s 907, 1991 c 80 s 3, & 1989 13 c 271 s 507; 14 (4) RCW 82.64.040 and 1994 sp.s. c 7 s 908, 1991 c 80 s 7, & 1989 15 c 271 s 508; and (5) RCW 82.64.050 and 1991 c 80 s 4. 16

17 **Sec. 2.** RCW 69.50.520 and 1995 2nd sp.s. c 18 s 919 are each 18 amended to read as follows:

p. 1

The violence reduction and drug enforcement account is created in 1 All designated receipts from 2 treasury. the state RCW 9.41.110(((7)))(8), 66.24.210(4), 66.24.290(3), 69.50.505(h)(1),3 82.08.150(5), 82.24.020(2), ((82.64.020,)) and section 420, chapter 4 271, Laws of 1989 shall be deposited into the account. Expenditures 5 from the account may be used only for funding services and programs 6 under chapter 271, Laws of 1989 and chapter 7, Laws of 1994 sp. sess., 7 8 including state incarceration costs. After July 1, 1997, at least 9 seven and one-half percent of expenditures from the account shall be 10 used for providing grants to community networks under chapter 70.190 RCW by the family policy council. 11

12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. This act does not affect any existing right 13 acquired or liability or obligation incurred under the sections 14 repealed in this act or under any rule or order adopted under those 15 sections, nor does it affect any proceeding instituted under those 16 sections.

17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. This act is necessary for the immediate 18 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the 19 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect 20 July 1, 1997.
