## HOUSE BILL 2254

State of Washington55th Legislature1997 Regular SessionBy Representatives Skinner and Cody

Read first time 03/13/97. Referred to Committee on Health Care.

AN ACT Relating to authorizing dispensing opticians to perform eye refraction and modify existing prescriptions to reflect changes in vision; amending RCW 18.34.020, 18.34.060, 18.34.050, 18.34.080, 18.34.120, 18.34.136, and 18.34.010; adding new sections to chapter 18.34 RCW; recodifying RCW 18.34.010 and 18.34.060; and repealing RCW 18.34.110.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

8 Sec. 1. RCW 18.34.020 and 1995 c 178 s 1 are each amended to read 9 as follows:

10 The term "secretary" wherever used in this chapter ((shall)) means the secretary of health of the state of Washington. 11 The term "apprentice" wherever used in this chapter ((<del>shall</del>)) mean<u>s</u> a person who 12 13 ((shall be)) is designated an apprentice in the records of the 14 secretary at the request of a physician, registered optometrist, or 15 licensee hereunder, who shall thereafter be the primary supervisor of The apprentice may thereafter receive from a 16 the apprentice. physician, registered optometrist, or licensee hereunder training and 17 direct supervision in the work of a dispensing optician. 18 The term "refracting" whenever used in this chapter means the measurement of the 19

powers or range of a person's vision by the use of a series of lenses 1 and their rotation to determine the degree of correction needed to 2 compensate for hyperopia, myopia, presbyopia, astigmatism, or any 3 4 combination of these. "Prescription" means the written directive from an ophthalmologist or optometrist for corrective lenses and consists of 5 the refractive powers. If the patient wishes to purchase contact 6 7 lenses, the prescription must contain a notation that the patient is 8 "o.k. for contact" or similar language confirming there are no contraindications for contacts. "Prescription modification" whenever 9 used in this chapter means the ability of a certified refracting 10 optician to alter a prescription within plus or minus 2.00 diopters and 11 to give the patient a copy of the changes to take with him or her to a 12 provider of choice. 13

14 **Sec. 2.** RCW 18.34.060 and 1957 c 43 s 6 are each amended to read 15 as follows:

16 A dispensing optician is a person who prepares duplications of, or dispenses lenses, spectacles, eyeglasses 17 and and/or prepares 18 appurtenances thereto to the intended wearers thereof on written 19 prescriptions from physicians or optometrists, and in accordance with ((such)) the prescriptions, measures, adapts, adjusts and fabricates 20 ((such)) the lenses, spectacles, eyeglasses and/or appurtenances 21 22 thereto to the human face for the aid or correction of visual or ocular 23 anomalies of the human eye((: PROVIDED, HOWEVER, That)). However, 24 contact lenses may be fitted only upon a written prescription of a 25 physician or optometrist. <u>A refracting optician is a licensed</u> dispensing optician in the state who has been certified to practice 26 refraction and who has been authorized by the secretary to modify 27 prescriptions. 28

29 Sec. 3. RCW 18.34.050 and 1984 c 287 s 32 are each amended to read 30 as follows:

The dispensing optician examining committee shall meet at such times as deemed necessary by the secretary to prepare and administer the state's licensing examinations and to provide technical expertise, advise, and make recommendations to the secretary on the administration of the dispensing optician statute and disciplinary matters of licensees. The examining committee ((shall)) consists of ((three)) four persons. Three persons must be primarily engaged in the business of dispensing opticians and ((who currently)) hold a ((valid)) current license under this chapter. <u>One member must be a member of the general</u> <u>public</u>. Members of the committee shall be compensated in accordance with RCW 43.03.240 and shall be reimbursed for travel expenses in accordance with RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060.

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 18.34 RCW 7 to read as follows:

8 An applicant for certification as a refracting optician must first 9 be licensed as a dispensing optician by the state and meet the 10 following educational requirements approved by the secretary:

(1) Completion of eighty hours of coursework including, but not limited to, the following topics: Theory of refraction, anatomy, pathology, and knowledge of equipment operation;

(2) Completion of a twenty-hour practicum. The twenty hours are
under the direct supervision of a licensed optometrist or a licensed
ophthalmologist;

17 (3) Continuing education requirements as determined by the18 secretary.

The secretary shall adopt by rule the examination requirements to certify refracting opticians. An applicant for certification as a refracting optician may take the examination if he or she pays an examination fee, determined by the secretary, as provided in RCW 43.70.250.

24 **Sec. 5.** RCW 18.34.080 and 1995 c 198 s 3 are each amended to read 25 as follows:

(1) The examination to license a dispensing optician shall 26 27 determine whether the applicant has a thorough knowledge of the 28 principles governing the practice of a dispensing optician which is 29 hereby declared necessary for the protection of the public health. The examining committee may approve an examination prepared or administered 30 31 by a private testing agency or association of licensing authorities. 32 The secretary shall license successful examinees and the license shall 33 be conspicuously displayed in the place of business of the licensee. (2) The examination to certify a refracting optician shall 34 determine whether the applicant has a thorough knowledge of the 35 principles governing the practice of refraction. The examining 36

 displayed in the place of business of the certified licensee.

4 Sec. 6. RCW 18.34.120 and 1996 c 191 s 18 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

Each licensee ((hereunder)) or certificate holder under this 6 7 chapter shall pay a renewal registration fee determined by the secretary as provided in RCW 43.70.250 and 43.70.280. The secretary 8 9 adopt rules establishing mandatory continuing education may requirements to be met by persons applying for license or certificate 10 11 renewal.

12 **Sec. 7.** RCW 18.34.136 and 1987 c 150 s 19 are each amended to read 13 as follows:

The uniform disciplinary act, chapter 18.130 RCW, governs unlicensed practice, the issuance and denial of licenses, and the discipline of licensees under this chapter. <u>No person may practice or</u> <u>represent himself or herself as a refracting optician without first</u> <u>having a valid certificate to do so.</u>

19 Sec. 8. RCW 18.34.010 and 1957 c 43 s 1 are each amended to read 20 as follows:

21 Nothing in this chapter shall:

(1) Be construed to limit or restrict a duly licensed physician or optometrist or employees working under the personal supervision of a duly licensed physician or optometrist from the practices enumerated in this chapter, and each such licensed physician and optometrist shall have all the rights and privileges which may accrue under this chapter to dispensing opticians licensed hereunder;

(2) Be construed to prohibit an unlicensed person from performing
 mechanical work upon inert matter in an optical office, laboratory, or
 shop;

(3) Be construed to prohibit an unlicensed person from engaging in the sale of spectacles, eyeglasses, magnifying glasses, goggles, sunglasses, telescopes, binoculars, or any such articles which are completely preassembled and sold only as merchandise;

(4) Be construed to authorize or permit a licensee ((hereunder))
 <u>under this chapter</u> to hold himself <u>or herself</u> out as being able to, or

1 to offer to, or to undertake to attempt, by any manner of means, to 2 ((examine or)) exercise eyes, diagnose, treat, ((correct,)) relieve, 3 operate, or prescribe for any human ailment, ((deficiency,)) deformity, 4 disease, or injury.

If a certified refracting optician is unable to select lenses that 5 provide at a minimum 20/40 vision in either eye to the consumer, he or 6 7 she shall refer the consumer to a licensed optometrist or 8 ophthalmologist. If a certified refracting optician is unable to 9 select lenses that provide less than a two line difference of acuity between the two eyes of a child under age ten, he or she shall refer 10 the child to a licensed optometrist or ophthalmologist. If a certified 11 refracting optician is observing change of more than plus or minus 2.00 12 diopter of power in either eye, he or she shall refer the consumer to 13 a licensed optometrist or ophthalmologist. A certified refracting 14 15 optician may only modify a prescription for a consumer that has had an 16 eye health exam within two years for contact lenses and within four 17 years for glasses.

18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 9. RCW 18.34.110 and 1991 c 3 s 78 & 1957 c 43 19 s 11 are each repealed.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 10. RCW 18.34.010, to be codified between RCW
 18.34.141 and 18.34.900, and RCW 18.34.060, to be codified between RCW
 18.34.020 and 18.34.030, are each recodified.
