1 AN ACT Relating to special event endorsements to full service 2 private club licenses; amending RCW 66.24.450; and providing an 3 effective date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 Sec. 1. RCW 66.24.450 and 1997 c 321 s 30 are each amended to read 6 as follows:

7 (1) No club shall be entitled to a full service private club 8 license:

9 (a) Unless such private club has been in continuous operation for 10 at least one year immediately prior to the date of its application for 11 such license;

(b) Unless the private club premises be constructed and equipped,
conducted, managed, and operated to the satisfaction of the board and
in accordance with this title and the regulations made thereunder;

15 (c) Unless the board shall have determined pursuant to any 16 regulations made by it with respect to private clubs, that such private 17 club is a bona fide private club; it being the intent of this section 18 that license shall not be granted to a club which is, or has been, 19 primarily formed or activated to obtain a license to sell liquor, but 1 solely to a bona fide private club, where the sale of liquor is 2 incidental to the main purposes of the private club, as defined in RCW 3 66.04.010(7).

4 (2) The annual fee for a full service private club license, whether 5 inside or outside of an incorporated city or town, is seven hundred 6 twenty dollars per year.

7 (3) The board may issue an endorsement to the full service private club license that allows up to fifty nonclub, member-sponsored events 8 using club liquor. Visitors and quests may attend these events only by 9 invitation of the sponsoring member or members. These events may not 10 be open to the general public. The fee for the endorsement shall be an 11 annual fee of four hundred eighty dollars. Upon the board's request, 12 the holder of the endorsement must provide the board or the board's 13 designee with the following information at least seventy-two hours 14 prior to the event: The date, time, and location of the event; the 15 name of the sponsor of the event; and a brief description of the 16 17 purpose of the event.

18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. This act takes effect July 1, 1998.

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
