## SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 2959

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State of Washington 55th Legislature 1998 Regular Session

- 1 AN ACT Relating to higher education collaboration grants; and
- 2 adding new sections to chapter 28B.10 RCW.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. (1) The legislature finds that it is in the public interest to encourage and enhance cooperation among institutions of higher education. It is the policy of the state to facilitate interinstitutional coordination, planning, and collaborative
- 8 arrangements to avoid duplication and make efficient use of educational
- 9 facilities, including independent institutions of higher education.
- 10 (2) In order to secure for the citizens of Washington the
- 11 advantages that would accrue through cooperative programs that meet
- 12 specific educational, business, and societal needs, the board may
- 13 provide collaboration grants for the planning and design of programs
- 14 offered by two or more institutions of higher education using
- 15 appropriated funds. Collaboration grants shall increase access to two-
- 16 year and four-year programs, use available infrastructure, avoid
- 17 duplication, and encourage cooperation among institutions of higher
- 18 education.

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- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. Unless the context clearly requires otherwise the definitions in this section apply throughout sections 1 through 4 of this act.
- 4 (1) "Instructional program" means a course of study leading to certification, licensure, or a degree at the associate, baccalaureate, 6 master's or doctoral level.
- 7 (2) "Independent institution of higher education" means a private, 8 nonprofit educational institution, the main campus of which is 9 permanently situated in the state, which is open to residents of the 10 state, which does not restrict entry on racial or religious grounds, 11 which provides programs of education beyond high school leading at 12 least to the baccalaureate degree, and which is accredited by the 13 Northwest association of schools and colleges.
- 14 (3) "Public institution of higher education" means a college or 15 university as defined in RCW 28B.10.016.
- 16 (4) "Board" means the higher education coordinating board.
- Sec. 3. The board, using funds appropriated 17 NEW SECTION. 18 therefor, may award collaboration grants for the planning and design of 19 instructional programs. Collaborative grants may be used to fund proposals that include public and independent institutions of higher 20 education. The criteria for awarding the grants must be uniform and 21 22 applicable to all eligible colleges and universities and the proposals 23 shall meet the following conditions:
- 24 (1) The program shall be offered by two or more eligible 25 institutions of higher education;
- 26 (2) The collaboration among institutions of higher education shall 27 be a cost-effective means to provide the program;
- 28 (3) The program shall expand student access; and
- 29 (4) The program shall make use of existing classroom space and 30 faculty expertise.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. The board shall assure continuing evaluation of the effectiveness of the collaboration grants authorized by section 3 of this act, and before December of each even-numbered year shall submit a report to the governor and legislature. In administering the grants, the board shall require the use of appropriate fiscal procedures to ensure accountability of public funds.

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- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. Sections 1 through 4 of this act are each 2 added to chapter 28B.10 RCW.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. If any provision of this act or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other persons or circumstances is not affected.

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
