1 AN ACT Relating to permitting individuals to bring food or food
2 items into stadiums; and amending RCW 36.100.030 and 36.102.050.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 36.100.030 and 1995 1st sp.s. c 14 s 3 are each
5 amended to read as follows:

6 (1) A public facilities district is authorized to acquire,
7 construct, own, remodel, maintain, equip, reequip, repair, and operate
8 sports facilities, entertainment facilities, or convention facilities,
9 or any combination of such facilities, together with contiguous parking
10 facilities. The taxes that are provided for in this chapter may only
11 be imposed for these purposes.

12 (2)(a) A public facilities district may enter into agreements under
13 chapter 39.34 RCW for the joint provision and operation of such
14 facilities and may enter into contracts under chapter 39.34 RCW where
15 any party to the contract provides and operates such facilities for the
16 other party or parties to the contract.

17 (b) An agreement entered into under (a) of this subsection must
18 contain provisions that allow individuals attending events at the
19 stadium to bring food or food items for consumption inside the stadium.

1 As used in this subsection, "food or food items" does not include
2 alcoholic beverages of any type. As used in this subsection, "stadium"
3 means a "baseball stadium" as defined in RCW 82.14.0485.

4 (3) Notwithstanding the establishment of a career, civil, or merit
5 service system, a public ((~~facility~~ {~~facilities~~}) facilities district
6 may contract with a public or private entity for the operation or
7 management of its public facilities.

8 (4) A public facilities district is authorized to use the
9 supplemental alternative public works contracting procedures set forth
10 in chapter 39.10 RCW in connection with the design, construction,
11 reconstruction, remodel, or alteration of any of its public facilities.

12 (5) A public facilities district may impose charges and fees for
13 the use of its facilities, and may accept and expend or use gifts,
14 grants, and donations.

15 **Sec. 2.** RCW 36.102.050 and 1997 c 220 s 105 (Referendum Bill No.
16 48) are each amended to read as follows:

17 (1) The public stadium authority is authorized to acquire,
18 construct, own, remodel, maintain, equip, reequip, repair, and operate
19 a stadium and exhibition center as defined in RCW 36.102.010.

20 (2)(a) The public stadium authority may enter into agreements under
21 chapter 39.34 RCW for the joint provision and operation of a stadium
22 and exhibition center and may enter into contracts under chapter 39.34
23 RCW where any party to the contract provides and operates the stadium
24 and exhibition center for the other party or parties to the contract.

25 (b) An agreement entered into under (a) of this subsection must
26 contain provisions that allow individuals attending events at the
27 stadium and exhibition center to bring food or food items for
28 consumption inside the stadium and exhibition center. As used in this
29 subsection, "food or food items" does not include alcoholic beverages
30 of any type.

31 (3) Any employees of the public stadium authority shall be
32 unclassified employees not subject to the provisions of chapter 41.06
33 RCW and a public stadium authority may contract with a public or
34 private entity for the operation or management of the stadium and
35 exhibition center.

36 (4) The public stadium authority is authorized to use the
37 alternative supplemental public works contracting procedures set forth
38 in chapter 39.10 RCW in connection with the design, construction,

1 reconstruction, remodel, or alteration of a stadium and exhibition
2 center.

3 (5) The public stadium authority may impose charges and fees for
4 the use of the stadium and exhibition center, and may accept and expend
5 or use gifts, grants, and donations.

6 (6) The public stadium authority shall comply with the prevailing
7 wage requirements of chapter 39.12 RCW and goals established for women
8 and minority-business participation for the county.

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
