## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 4408

State of Washington55th Legislature1997 Regular SessionBy Representatives Thompson, Buck, Sheldon, Sump, Alexander and DeBoltRead first time 02/24/97.Referred to Committee on Natural Resources.

WHEREAS, The legislature is the ultimate trustee of the state's
 forest trust lands; and

3 WHEREAS, The legislature is concerned that the trust beneficiaries 4 of our state forest lands receive all the benefits of those lands to 5 which they are entitled; and

6 WHEREAS, The legislature is concerned that the rate of return 7 generated by the current management of state forest lands is less than 8 what it could be if the lands were managed under an alternative 9 approach;

10 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the House of Representatives of 11 the state of Washington, the Senate concurring, That there is created 12 a joint select committee on the management of state forest lands to 13 compare the current management approach on state forest lands with 14 management approaches used in the private sector, and to make 15 recommendations to the legislature and to the department of natural 16 resources based on its findings; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the joint select committee shall consist of six members, three members from the House of Representatives and three members from the Senate. The speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint the House members, appointing at least one member from each caucus. The president of the Senate shall appoint

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1 the Senate members, appointing at least one member from each caucus.
2 The committee shall choose a chair and vice-chair from among its
3 membership; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the joint select committee shall scrutinize current management practices used on state forest lands and shall compare these management practices to the management regimes used on privately owned commercial timber lands. At a minimum, the committee shall compare management policies and the associated costs and returns of:

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) (1) The choice and production of nursery stock;

11 (2) Tree planting;

12 (3) Interim silvicultural operations such as fertilizing,13 application of pesticides, and thinning;

14 (4) Approaches to compliance with the federal endangered species 15 act; and

16 (5) Harvest quantities and policies.

17 The committee shall also analyze the effect of current federal 18 policy on log exports from public lands and shall identify the 19 difference this creates in returns generated by state forest lands 20 versus private commercial forest lands. The department of natural 21 resources shall provide information to the committee necessary to 22 complete its analysis; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the joint select committee shall be staffed by Senate committee services and the House of Representatives office of program research; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the joint select committee shall complete its analysis and report its recommendations to the Legislature by December 1, 1997; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the joint select committee expires April 1, 1998.

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
