1 TO THE HONORABLE JUSTICES OF THE WASHINGTON STATE SUPREME COURT:

We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully represent and petition as follows:

WHEREAS, All people of the State of Washington, including judicial candidates and judicial officers at all levels, have a fundamental right to free speech under the First Amendment to the United States Constitution and Article I, Section 5 of the State Constitution; and

WHEREAS, All people of the State of Washington, including judicial candidates and judicial officers, have the right to freedom of religion and conscience as protected by the First Amendment to the United States Constitution and Article I, Section 11 of the State Constitution; and

WHEREAS, All people of the State of Washington, including judicial candidates and judicial officers at all levels, have a right to be free from invidious viewpoint discrimination under the First Amendment to the United States Constitution and Article I, Section 11 of the State

WHEREAS, All people of the State of Washington, including judicial candidates and judicial officers at all levels, have a right to be free from arbitrary and capricious governmental action which would deprive them of the right to life, liberty, or property without due process of

- 3 WHEREAS, All people of the State of Washington, including judicial

- 17 Seven of the Code of Judicial Conduct, and any other pertinent

- 19 that all judicial candidates and judicial officers may speak freely,
- 20 and without fear of governmental retaliation, on issues that are not
- 21 then before the court.
