- 11 practice of respiratory care at the level of certification)) in order

- 13 to promote public welfare, a person practicing or offering to practice
- 14 respiratory care as a respiratory care practitioner in this state shall
- 15 be required to submit evidence that he or she is qualified to practice,
- 16 and shall be licensed as provided. The settings for these services may
- 17 include, health facilities licensed in this state, clinics, home care,
- 18 home health agencies, physicians' offices, and public or community
- 19 health services. Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to require

- 1 that individual or group policies or contracts of an insurance carrier,
- 2 health care service contractor, or health maintenance organization
- 3 provide benefits or coverage for services and supplies provided by a
- 4 person certified under this chapter.
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 18.89 RCW

- 16 and physiological ((ventilatory)) support;
- 17 $((\frac{(6)}{(6)}))$ <u>(f)</u> Postural drainage, chest percussion, and vibration;
- 18 $((\frac{7}{}))$ (g) Bronchopulmonary hygiene;
- 19 $((\frac{8}{8}))$ (h) Cardiopulmonary resuscitation as it pertains to
- 20 ((establishing airways and external cardiac compression)) advanced

- $((\frac{9}{}))$ (i) The maintenance of natural and artificial airways and

 the government of the United States while the individual is engaged in

(5) "Inspection" means the periodic examination of practitioners by a state agency in order to ascertain whether the practitioners' occupation is being carried out in a fashion consistent with the public health, safety, and welfare.

- (6) "Legislative committees of reference" means the standing legislative committees designated by the respective rules committees of the senate and house of representatives to consider proposed legislation to regulate health professions not previously regulated.
- 32 (7) "License," "licensing," and "licensure" mean permission to 33 engage in a health profession which would otherwise be unlawful in the 34 state in the absence of the permission. A license is granted to those 35 individuals who meet prerequisite qualifications to perform prescribed 36 health professional tasks and for the use of a particular title.
- 37 (8) "Professional license" means an individual, nontransferable 38 authorization to carry on a health activity based on qualifications 39 which include: (a) Graduation from an accredited or approved program,

- and (b) acceptable performance on a qualifying examination or series of examinations.
- 3 (9) "Practitioner" means an individual who (a) has achieved 4 knowledge and skill by practice, and (b) is actively engaged in a 5 specified health profession.
- 6 (10) "Public member" means an individual who is not, and never was,

- 12 (11) "Registration" means the formal notification which, prior to 13 rendering services, a practitioner shall submit to a state agency 14 setting forth the name and address of the practitioner; the location, 15 nature and operation of the health activity to be practiced; and, if 16 required by the regulatory entity, a description of the service to be 17 provided.
- 18 (12) "Regulatory entity" means any board, commission, agency, 19 division, or other unit or subunit of state government which regulates 20 one or more professions, occupations, industries, businesses, or other 21 endeavors in this state.
- (13) "State agency" includes every state office, department, board, commission, regulatory entity, and agency of the state, and, where provided by law, programs and activities involving less than the full responsibility of a state agency.
