1 AN ACT Relating to permit processing; adding new sections to
2 chapter 90.48 RCW; and creating a new section.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** The purpose of this act is to encourage
5 environmental permit program efficiency and pollution prevention
6 through increased private sector participation in the preparation of
7 air and wastewater discharge permits currently administered by the
8 department of ecology. The legislature recognizes that pollution
9 prevention can often be accomplished through cooperative partnerships
10 between government and industry and through voluntary changes in
11 industrial production methods. By using expertise available in the
12 private sector, the permit preparation option provided in this act is
13 intended to reduce the time required to issue wastewater discharge
14 permits and better protect the water quality of the state.

15 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 90.48 RCW
16 to read as follows:

17 Within fifteen days of receipt of an application for the issuance,
18 renewal, or modification of a permit under RCW 90.48.160 or 90.48.260,

1 the department shall determine whether it is likely that the permit
2 will be processed within one hundred eighty days. If the permit will
3 not be processed within one hundred eighty days, the applicant shall be
4 notified. Upon receipt of this notification, an applicant may choose
5 to withdraw the application and proceed with the draft permit
6 preparation option in section 3 of this act.

7 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 90.48 RCW
8 to read as follows:

9 (1) Any person applying for the issuance, renewal, or modification
10 of a permit under RCW 90.48.160 or 90.48.260 may submit an application
11 in the form of a draft permit and fact sheet.

12 (2) The department shall approve or deny the permit proposal within
13 forty-five days of submission if no public hearing is required, or
14 within ninety days of submission if a public hearing is required. The
15 department may seek to negotiate a permit proposal with the applicant
16 if both parties agree to the process. The department retains full
17 authority under this chapter to approve, modify, or disapprove any
18 draft permit or fact sheet submitted under this section.

19 (3) The department shall make available guidelines specifying the
20 elements of a complete draft permit and fact sheet, and a list of
21 approved contractors with whom applicants may contract for draft permit
22 preparation.

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
