## SENATE BILL 5455

State of Washington55th Legislature1997 Regular SessionBy Senators Wood, Kohl and Winsley

Read first time 01/27/97. Referred to Committee on Higher Education.

1 AN ACT Relating to higher education tuition; amending RCW 2 28B.15.067; and creating a new section.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. It is the intent of the legislature to NEW SECTION. 5 provide for the higher education needs of the citizens of the state of Washington and to set tuition at the institutions of higher education б 7 in a manner that is responsible, stable, and predictable. This will enable families and students to plan for the financing of a college 8 9 education secure in the fact that the quality of instruction and of the 10 overall educational experience at each of the institutions of higher education will be at least maintained and optimally enhanced. Further, 11 12 this commits the state to the proposition that the relative financial 13 burden of education should not significantly increase for Washington 14 students and their families.

15 Sec. 2. RCW 28B.15.067 and 1996 c 212 s 1 are each amended to read 16 as follows:

(1) Tuition fees shall be established under the provisions of thischapter.

1 (2) Academic year tuition for full-time students at the state's 2 institutions of higher education for the ((<del>1995-96</del>)) <u>1997-98</u> academic 3 year, other than the summer term, shall be as provided in this 4 subsection.

5 (a) At the University of Washington and Washington State6 University:

7 (i) For resident undergraduate students and other resident students 8 not in graduate study programs or enrolled in programs leading to the 9 degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of 10 veterinary medicine, ((two thousand seven hundred sixty-four)) three 11 thousand eighteen dollars;

(ii) For nonresident undergraduate students and other nonresident students not in graduate study programs or enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, eight thousand two hundred sixty-eight dollars;

17 (iii) For resident graduate and law students not enrolled in 18 programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental 19 surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, four thousand four hundred 20 ninety dollars;

(iv) For nonresident graduate and law students not enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, eleven thousand six hundred thirty-four dollars;

(v) For resident students enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, seven thousand four hundred ninety-seven dollars; and

(vi) For nonresident students enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, nineteen thousand four hundred thirty-one dollars.

32 (b) At the regional universities and The Evergreen State College:
33 (i) For resident undergraduate and all other resident students not
34 in graduate study programs, two thousand forty-five dollars;

35 (ii) For nonresident undergraduate and all other nonresident 36 students not in graduate study programs, seven thousand nine hundred 37 ninety-two dollars;

(iii) For resident graduate students, three thousand four hundredforty-three dollars; and

(iv) For nonresident graduate students, eleven thousand seventy-one
 dollars.

3 (c) At the community colleges:

4 (i) For resident students, one thousand two hundred twelve dollars;5 and

6 (ii) For nonresident students, five thousand one hundred sixty-two7 dollars and fifty cents.

8 (3) Academic year tuition for full-time students at the state's 9 institutions of higher education beginning with the ((<del>1996-97</del>)) <u>1998-99</u> 10 academic year, other than the summer term, shall be as provided in this 11 subsection.

12 (a) At the University of Washington and Washington State 13 University:

(i) For resident undergraduate students and other resident students not in graduate study programs or enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, ((two thousand eight hundred seventy-five)) three thousand one hundred seventy-one dollars;

(ii) For nonresident undergraduate students and other nonresident students not in graduate study programs or enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, nine thousand four hundred ninety-one dollars;

(iii) For resident graduate and law students not enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, four thousand six hundred sixty-nine dollars;

(iv) For nonresident graduate and law students not enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, twelve thousand one hundred dollars;

32 (v) For resident students enrolled in programs leading to the 33 degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of 34 veterinary medicine, seven thousand seven hundred ninety-seven dollars; 35 and

(vi) For nonresident students enrolled in programs leading to the
 degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of
 veterinary medicine, twenty thousand two hundred nine dollars.

39 (b) At the regional universities and The Evergreen State College:

(i) For resident undergraduate and all other resident students not
 in graduate study programs, two thousand one hundred twenty-seven
 dollars;

4 (ii) For nonresident undergraduate and all other nonresident
5 students not in graduate study programs, eight thousand three hundred
6 twelve dollars;

7 (iii) For resident graduate students, three thousand five hundred8 eighty-one dollars; and

9 (iv) For nonresident graduate students, eleven thousand five 10 hundred fourteen dollars.

11 (c) At the community colleges:

12 (i) For resident students, one thousand two hundred sixty-one13 dollars; and

14 (ii) For nonresident students, five thousand three hundred15 sixty-nine dollars and fifty cents.

16 (4) <u>Beginning with the 1999-2000 academic year, tuition for</u> 17 <u>full-time students, other than the summer term, at the University of</u> 18 <u>Washington and Washington State University for resident undergraduate</u> 19 <u>students and other resident students not in graduate study programs or</u> 20 <u>enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine,</u> 21 <u>doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, shall be</u> 22 <u>three thousand three hundred twenty-seven dollars.</u>

(5) Beginning with the 2000-01 academic year, tuition for full-time students, other than the summer term, at the University of Washington and Washington State University for resident undergraduate students and other resident students not in graduate study programs or enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, shall be three thousand four hundred ninety-five dollars.

30 <u>(6)</u> The tuition fees established under this chapter shall not apply 31 to high school students enrolling in community colleges under RCW 32 28A.600.300 through 28A.600.395.

33 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. If any provision of this act or its 34 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the 35 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other 36 persons or circumstances is not affected.
