SENATE BILL 5483

State of Washington 55th Legislature 1997 Regular Session

AN ACT Relating to licensing whitewater river outfitters; amending RCW 88.12.010, 88.12.235, 88.12.245, 88.12.255, 88.12.265, 88.12.275, and 19.02.050; adding new sections to chapter 88.12 RCW; and prescribing penalties.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 **Sec. 1.** RCW 88.12.010 and 1993 c 244 s 5 are each amended to read 7 as follows:

8 Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitions in 9 this section apply throughout this chapter.

(1) "Boat wastes" includes, but is not limited to, sewage, garbage, marine debris, plastics, contaminated bilge water, cleaning solvents, paint scrapings, or discarded petroleum products associated with the use of vessels.

(2) "Boater" means any person on a vessel on waters of the state ofWashington.

16 (3) "Carrying passengers for hire" means carrying passengers in a 17 vessel on waters of the state for valuable consideration, whether given 18 directly or indirectly or received by the owner, agent, operator, or 19 other person having an interest in the vessel. This shall not include

trips where expenses for food, transportation, or incidentals are 1 shared by participants on an even basis. Anyone receiving compensation 2 for skills or money for amortization of equipment and carrying 3 4 passengers shall be considered to be carrying passengers for hire on 5 waters of the state.

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(4) "Commission" means the state parks and recreation commission.

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(5) "Darkness" means that period between sunset and sunrise.

8 (6) "Environmentally sensitive area" means a restricted body of 9 water where discharge of untreated sewage from boats is especially 10 detrimental because of limited flushing, shallow water, commercial or recreational shellfish, swimming areas, diversity of species, the 11 absence of other pollution sources, or other characteristics. 12

(7) <u>"Guide" means any individual, including but not limited to</u> 13 subcontractors and independent contractors, engaged for compensation or 14 15 other consideration by a whitewater river outfitter for the purpose of 16 operating vessels.

17 (8) "Marina" means a facility providing boat moorage space, fuel, or commercial services. Commercial services include but are not 18 19 limited to overnight or live-aboard boating accommodations.

20 (((+))) (9) "Motor driven boats and vessels" means all boats and vessels which are self propelled. 21

(((9))) <u>(10)</u> "Muffler" or "muffler system" 22 means a sound 23 suppression device or system, including an underwater exhaust system, 24 designed and installed to abate the sound of exhaust gases emitted from 25 an internal combustion engine and that prevents excessive or unusual 26 noise.

27 (((10))) (11) "Operate" means to steer, direct, or otherwise have physical control of a vessel that is underway. 28

29 (((11))) <u>(12)</u> "Operator" means an individual who steers, directs, 30 or otherwise has physical control of a vessel that is underway or exercises actual authority to control the person at the helm. 31

((((12))) <u>(13)</u> "Observer" means the individual riding in a vessel 32 who is responsible for observing a water skier at all times. 33

34 (((13))) (14) "Owner" means a person who has a lawful right to 35 possession of a vessel by purchase, exchange, gift, lease, inheritance, or legal action whether or not the vessel is subject to a security 36 37 interest.

(((14))) <u>(15)</u> "Person" means any individual, sole proprietorship, 38 39 partnership, corporation, nonprofit corporation or organization,

limited liability company, firm, association, or other legal entity
 located within or outside this state.

3 <u>(16)</u> "Personal flotation device" means a buoyancy device, life 4 preserver, buoyant vest, ring buoy, or buoy cushion that is designed to 5 float a person in the water and that is approved by the commission.

6 (((15))) (17) "Personal watercraft" means a vessel of less than 7 sixteen feet that uses a motor powering a water jet pump, as its 8 primary source of motive power and that is designed to be operated by 9 a person sitting, standing, or kneeling on, or being towed behind the 10 vessel, rather than in the conventional manner of sitting or standing 11 inside the vessel.

12 (((16))) <u>(18)</u> "Polluted area" means a body of water used by boaters 13 that is contaminated by boat wastes at unacceptable levels, based on 14 applicable water quality and shellfish standards.

15 (((17))) <u>(19)</u> "Public entities" means all elected or appointed 16 bodies, including tribal governments, responsible for collecting and 17 spending public funds.

18 (((18))) <u>(20)</u> "Reckless" or "recklessly" means acting carelessly 19 and heedlessly in a willful and wanton disregard of the rights, safety, 20 or property of another.

21 (((19))) <u>(21)</u> "Sewage pumpout or dump unit" means:

(a) A receiving chamber or tank designed to receive vessel sewagefrom a "porta-potty" or a portable container; and

(b) A stationary or portable mechanical device on land, a dock,
pier, float, barge, vessel, or other location convenient to boaters,
designed to remove sewage waste from holding tanks on vessels.

27 (((20))) (22) "Underway" means that a vessel is not at anchor, or 28 made fast to the shore, or aground.

(((21))) (23) "Vessel" includes every description of watercraft on the water, other than a seaplane, used or capable of being used as a means of transportation on the water. However, it does not include inner tubes, air mattresses, and small rafts or flotation devices or toys customarily used by swimmers.

34 (((22))) (24) "Water skiing" means the physical act of being towed 35 behind a vessel on, but not limited to, any skis, aquaplane, kneeboard, 36 tube, or any other similar device.

37 (((23))) (25) "Waters of the state" means any waters within the 38 territorial limits of Washington state.

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1 (((24))) (26) "Whitewater river outfitter" means any person who is
2 advertising to carry or carries passengers for hire on any whitewater
3 river of the state.

4 (27) "Whitewater rivers of the state" means those rivers and 5 streams, or parts thereof, within the boundaries of the state as listed 6 in RCW 88.12.265 or as designated by the commission under section 11 of 7 this act.

8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 88.12 RCW 9 to read as follows:

10 (1) No person shall act in the capacity of a paid whitewater river 11 outfitter, or advertise in any newspaper or magazine or any other trade 12 publication, or represent himself or herself as a whitewater river 13 outfitter in the state, without first obtaining a whitewater river 14 outfitter's license from the department of licensing in accordance with 15 RCW 88.12.275.

16 (2) Every whitewater river outfitter's license must, at all times,17 be conspicuously placed on the premises set forth in the license.

18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 88.12 RCW 19 to read as follows:

20 Any attempt by a commercial whitewater river outfitter to waive 21 liability for its own negligence is void as against public policy.

22 **Sec. 4.** RCW 88.12.235 and 1993 c 244 s 27 are each amended to read 23 as follows:

Except as provided in RCW 88.12.275(((3))), the commission of a prohibited act <u>or the omission of a required act</u> under RCW ((88.12.250)) <u>88.12.245</u> through 88.12.275 constitutes a misdemeanor, punishable as provided under RCW 9.92.030.

28 **Sec. 5.** RCW 88.12.245 and 1993 c 244 s 30 are each amended to read 29 as follows:

30 (1) While carrying passengers for hire on whitewater rivers in this 31 state, the ((operator and owner of the vessel)) <u>licensed whitewater</u> 32 <u>river outfitter</u> shall:

(a) If using inflatable vessels, use only vessels with three ormore separate air chambers;

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(b) Ensure that all passengers and ((operators)) guides are wearing 1 a securely fastened United States coast guard-approved type III or type 2 <u>V</u> personal flotation device <u>in good serviceable condition of the proper</u> 3 4 size for each person on board; (c) Ensure that each vessel has accessible a spare United States 5 coast guard-approved type III or type V personal flotation device in 6 7 good repair; (d) Ensure that each vessel has on it a bagged throwable line with 8 a floating line and bag; 9 10 (e) Ensure that each vessel has accessible an adequate first-aid kit; 11 (f) Ensure that each vessel has a spare propelling device; 12 13 (g) Ensure that a repair kit and air pump are accessible to inflatable vessel; ((and)) 14 15 (h) Ensure that equipment to prevent and treat hypothermia is accessible to all vessels on a trip; and 16 (i) Ensure that each vessel is operated by a guide who has complied 17 with the requirements of subsection (2) of this section. 18 19 (2) No person may ((operate on the whitewater rivers of this state 20 a vessel carrying passengers for hire unless the person)) act as a quide unless the individual is at least eighteen years of age and has 21 22 successfully completed: 23 (a) A lifesaving training course meeting standards adopted by the 24 commission; (b) A swiftwater river rescue course meeting standards adopted by 25 the commission; and 26 (c) A program of guide training on whitewater rivers meeting 27 standards adopted by the commission. In adopting guide training 28 29 standards, the commission shall require training programs to issue 30 proof of completion to any guide successfully completing the required 31 training program. In addition, the commission shall certify as acceptable each training program meeting the commission's standards and 32 33 maintain a list of those programs.

34 Sec. 6. RCW 88.12.255 and 1993 c 244 s 31 are each amended to read 35 as follows:

(1) ((Vessel operators and passengers)) Whitewater river outfitters
 and guides on any trip carrying passengers for hire on whitewater

rivers of the state shall not allow the use of alcohol during the
 course of a trip on a whitewater river section in this state.

3 (2) Any vessel carrying passengers for hire on any whitewater river 4 section in this state must be accompanied by at least one other vessel 5 ((under the supervision of the same operator or owner or)) being 6 operated by a ((person registered under RCW 88.12.275)) licensed 7 whitewater river outfitter or ((an operator)) a guide under the 8 direction or control of a ((person registered under RCW 88.12.275)) 9 licensed whitewater river outfitter.

10 Sec. 7. RCW 88.12.265 and 1986 c 217 s 8 are each amended to read 11 as follows:

12 Whitewater river sections include but are not limited to:

13 (1) Green river above Flaming Geyser state park;

14 (2) Klickitat river above the confluence with Summit creek;

15 (3) Methow river below the town of Carlton;

16 (4) Sauk river above the town of Darrington;

17 (5) Skagit river above Bacon creek;

18 (6) Suiattle river;

19 (7) Tieton river below Rimrock dam;

(8) Skykomish river below Sunset Falls and above the Highway 2
bridge one mile east of the town of Gold Bar;

(9) Wenatchee river above the Wenatchee county park at the town ofMonitor;

24 (10)

(10) White Salmon river; and

(11) Any other section of river designated a "whitewater river section" by the ((interagency committee for outdoor recreation. Such river sections shall be class two or greater difficulty under the international scale of whitewater difficulty)) commission under section 11 of this act.

30 Sec. 8. RCW 88.12.275 and 1995 c 399 s 216 are each amended to 31 read as follows:

(1) ((Any person carrying passengers for hire on whitewater river sections in this state may register with the department of licensing. Each registration application shall be submitted annually on a form provided by the department of licensing)) The department of licensing shall issue a whitewater river outfitter's license to an applicant who 1 submits a completed application, pays the required fee, and complies
2 with the requirements of this section.

3 (2) An applicant for a whitewater river outfitter's license shall
4 make application upon a form provided by the department of licensing.
5 The form must be submitted annually and ((shall)) include the following
6 information:

7 (a) The name, residence address, and residence telephone number, 8 and the business name, address, and telephone number of the 9 ((registrant)) applicant;

10 (b) <u>Certification that all employees</u>, <u>subcontractors</u>, <u>or</u> 11 <u>independent contractors hired as guides meet the training standards</u> 12 <u>adopted by the commission under section 11 of this act before carrying</u> 13 <u>any passengers for hire</u>;

14 (c) Proof that the ((registrant)) applicant has liability insurance 15 for a minimum of three hundred thousand dollars per claim for 16 occurrences by the ((registrant)) applicant and the ((registrant's)) 17 <u>applicant's</u> employees that result in bodily injury or property damage. All quides must be covered by the applicant's insurance policy; ((and 18 19 (c))) (d) Certification that the ((registrant)) applicant will 20 maintain the insurance for a period of not less than one year from the date of ((registration)) issuance of the license; 21

(e) Certification that the policy names the state and its political
 subdivisions as insureds; and

24 (f) Certification by the applicant that for a period of not less 25 than twenty-four months immediately preceding the application the 26 applicant:

(i) Has not had a license, permit, or certificate to carry
 passengers for hire on a river revoked by another state or by an agency
 of the government of the United States for any reason related to safety
 or insurance coverage requirements; and

(ii) Has not been denied the right to apply for a license, permit,
 or certificate to carry passengers for hire on a river by another
 state.

(((2))) (3) The department of licensing shall charge a fee for each application, to be set in accordance with RCW 43.24.086.

36 (((3))) (4) Any person advertising or representing ((themselves))
37 <u>himself or herself</u> as ((having registered under this section)) <u>a</u>
38 <u>whitewater river outfitter</u> who is not currently ((registered)) <u>licensed</u>
39 is guilty of a gross misdemeanor.

1 (((4))) (5) The department of licensing shall submit annually a
2 list of ((registered)) <u>licensed</u> persons and companies to the department
3 of community, trade, and economic development, tourism promotion
4 division.

5 (((5))) <u>(6)</u> If an insurance company cancels or refuses to renew 6 insurance for a ((registrant during the period of registration)) 7 <u>licensee</u>, the insurance company shall notify the department of 8 licensing in writing of the termination of coverage and its effective 9 date not less than thirty days before the effective date of 10 termination.

(a) Upon receipt of an insurance company termination notice, the 11 department of licensing shall send written notice to the ((registrant)) 12 licensee that on the effective date of termination the department of 13 14 licensing will ((suspend)) cancel the ((registration)) license unless 15 proof of insurance as required by this section is filed with the department of licensing before the effective date of the termination. 16 17 (b) If an insurance company fails to give notice of coverage termination, this failure shall not have the effect of continuing the 18

19 coverage.

(c) The department of licensing may ((suspend or revoke registration)) cancel a license under this section if the ((registrant)) licensee fails to maintain in full force and effect the insurance required by this section.

(((6))) (7) The state of Washington shall be immune from any civil action arising from ((a registration)) the issuance of a license under this section.

27 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 9. A new section is added to chapter 88.12 RCW 28 to read as follows:

The department of licensing may cancel the license of any whitewater river outfitter upon receipt of a court judgment for violation of any of the provisions of RCW 88.12.245 through 88.12.275. Local law enforcement officials shall forward a copy of the judgment to the department of licensing.

34 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 10. A new section is added to chapter 88.12 RCW 35 to read as follows:

The commission, in cooperation with the department of licensing, may adopt and enforce such rules, including the setting of fees, as may be consistent with and necessary to implement this chapter. The fees
 must approximate the cost of administration.

3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 11.** A new section is added to chapter 88.12 RCW 4 to read as follows:

5 The commission shall adopt rules that designate as whitewater 6 rivers all sections of rivers with at least one class III rapid or 7 greater, as described in the American whitewater affiliation's 8 whitewater safety code. Additionally, the commission shall adopt rules 9 pertaining to guide training and certification of training programs as 10 required by RCW 88.12.245(2). The commission is authorized to consider 11 the imposition of a schedule of fines for minor violations.

12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 12. A new section is added to chapter 88.12 RCW 13 to read as follows:

14 (1) The governor shall appoint an ad hoc advisory committee 15 consisting of:

(a) Two representatives of whitewater river outfitters or guides,each of whom is engaged in commercial river rafting in this state;

18 (b) One representative of the department of licensing;

19 (c) One representative of local law enforcement; and

20 (d) Three members of the public.

(2) The committee shall assist and advise the commission in the development of rules necessary to implement this chapter. The appointments to the committee expire at the time of adoption of the rules.

25 **Sec. 13.** RCW 19.02.050 and 1994 c 264 s 8 are each amended to read 26 as follows:

27 (((1))) The legislature hereby directs the full participation by 28 the following agencies in the implementation of this chapter:

29 (((a))) <u>(1)</u> Department of agriculture;

30 (((b))) <u>(2)</u> Secretary of state;

- 31 (((c))) <u>(3)</u> Department of social and health services;
- 32 (((d))) <u>(4)</u> Department of revenue;
- 33 (((e))) <u>(5)</u> Department of fish and wildlife;
