- AN ACT Relating to equalization of salary allocations for
- 2 certificated educational employees; and amending RCW 28A.400.200.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28A.400.200 and 1993 c 492 s 225 are each amended to 5 read as follows:
- 6 (1) Every school district board of directors shall fix, alter, 7 allow, and order paid salaries and compensation for all district 8 employees in conformance with this section.
- 9 (2)(a) Salaries for certificated instructional staff shall not be 10 less than the salary provided in the appropriations act in the state-11 wide salary allocation schedule for an employee with a baccalaureate 12 degree and zero years of service; and
- (b) Salaries for certificated instructional staff with a masters degree shall not be less than the salary provided in the appropriations act in the state-wide salary allocation schedule for an employee with a masters degree and zero years of service;
- 17 (3)(a) The actual average salary paid to basic education 18 certificated instructional staff shall not exceed the district's 19 average basic education certificated instructional staff salary used

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- for the state basic education allocations for that school year as 1 determined pursuant to RCW 28A.150.410. In allocating funds for salary 2 3 increases for certificated instructional staff, the legislature shall 4 not allocate any salary increase funds to a school district to the extent that the district's derived base salary for certificated 5 instructional staff for state allocation purposes exceeds the state-6 wide salary allocation schedule established in the biennial 7 8 appropriations act.
- 9 (b) Fringe benefit contributions for basic education certificated 10 instructional staff shall be included as salary under (a) of this subsection only to the extent that the district's actual average 11 benefit contribution exceeds the amount of the insurance benefits 12 allocation provided per certificated instructional staff unit in the 13 state operating appropriations act in effect at the time the 14 15 compensation is payable. For purposes of this section, fringe benefits 16 shall not include payment for unused leave for illness or injury under 17 28A.400.210; employer contributions for old age survivors 18 insurance, workers' compensation, unemployment compensation, and 19 retirement benefits under the Washington state retirement system; or employer contributions for health benefits in excess of the insurance 20 benefits allocation provided per certificated instructional staff unit 21 in the state operating appropriations act in effect at the time the 22 compensation is payable. A school district may not use state funds to 23 24 provide employer contributions for such excess health benefits.
- (c) Salary and benefits for certificated instructional staff in programs other than basic education shall be consistent with the salary and benefits paid to certificated instructional staff in the basic education program.
 - (4) Salaries and benefits for certificated instructional staff may exceed the limitations in subsection (3) of this section only by separate contract for additional time, additional responsibilities, or incentives. Supplemental contracts shall not cause the state to incur any present or future funding obligation. Supplemental contracts shall be subject to the collective bargaining provisions of chapter 41.59 RCW and the provisions of RCW 28A.405.240, shall not exceed one year, and if not renewed shall not constitute adverse change in accordance with RCW 28A.405.300 through 28A.405.380. No district may enter into a supplemental contract under this subsection for the provision of

- 2 Article IX, section 3 of the state Constitution.
- 3 (5) Employee benefit plans offered by any district shall comply
- 4 with RCW 28A.400.350 ((and)), 28A.400.275, and 28A.400.280.

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
