1 AN ACT Relating to health care authority standards for basic health 2 plan agents and brokers; and amending RCW 70.47.015.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 70.47.015 and 1995 c 265 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

6 (1) The legislature finds that the basic health plan has been an 7 effective program in providing health coverage for uninsured residents. 8 Further, since 1993, substantial amounts of public funds have been 9 allocated for subsidized basic health plan enrollment.

10 (2) It is the intent of the legislature that the basic health plan 11 enrollment be expanded expeditiously, consistent with funds available 12 in the health services account, with the goal of two hundred thousand 13 adult subsidized basic health plan enrollees and one hundred thirty 14 thousand children covered through expanded medical assistance services 15 by June 30, 1997, with the priority of providing needed health services 16 to children in conjunction with other public programs.

(3) Effective January 1, 1996, basic health plan enrollees whose
income is less than one hundred twenty-five percent of the federal
poverty level shall pay at least a ten-dollar premium share.

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(4) No later than July 1, 1996, the administrator shall implement 1 procedures whereby hospitals licensed under chapters 70.41 and 71.12 2 3 RCW, health carrier, rural health care facilities regulated under 4 chapter 70.175 RCW, and community and migrant health centers funded under RCW 41.05.220, may expeditiously assist patients and their 5 families in applying for basic health plan or medical assistance 6 7 coverage, and in submitting such applications directly to the health 8 care authority or the department of social and health services. The 9 health care authority and the department of social and health services 10 shall make every effort to simplify and expedite the application and enrollment process. 11

(5) No later than July 1, 1996, the administrator shall implement 12 13 procedures whereby health insurance agents and brokers, licensed under chapter 48.17 RCW, may expeditiously assist patients and their families 14 15 in applying for basic health plan or medical assistance coverage, and 16 in submitting such applications directly to the health care authority 17 or the department of social and health services. The administrator may establish: (a) Minimum educational requirements that must be completed 18 19 by the agents or brokers; (b) an appointment process for agents or brokers marketing the basic health plan; or (c) standards for 20 revocation of the appointment of an agent or broker to submit 21 applications for cause, including untrustworthy or incompetent conduct 22 or harm to the public. Brokers and agents shall be entitled to receive 23 24 a commission for each individual sale of the basic health plan to 25 anyone not ((at anytime previously)) signed up within the previous five 26 years and a commission for each group sale of the basic health plan. No commission shall be provided upon a renewal. Commissions shall be 27 determined based on the estimated annual cost of the basic health plan, 28 29 however, commissions shall not result in a reduction in the premium 30 amount paid to health carriers. For purposes of this section "health carrier" is as defined in RCW 48.43.005. The health care authority and 31 the department of social and health services shall make every effort to 32 33 simplify and expedite the application and enrollment process.

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
