1 AN ACT Relating to the regional fisheries enhancement group 2 advisory board; and amending RCW 75.50.115.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 75.50.115 and 1995 c 367 s 6 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

6 (1) The regional fisheries enhancement group advisory board shall:
7 (a) Assess the training and technical assistance needs of the
8 regional fisheries enhancement groups;

(b) Develop a training and technical assistance services plan in 9 10 order to provide timely, topical technical assistance and training services to regional fisheries enhancement groups. 11 The plan shall be 12 provided to the director and to the senate and house of representatives 13 natural resources committees no later than October 1, 1995, and shall be updated not less than every year. The advisory board shall provide 14 15 ample opportunity for the public and interested parties to participate 16 in the development of the plan. The plan shall include but is not 17 limited to:

(i) Establishment of an information clearinghouse service that isreadily available to regional fisheries enhancement groups. The

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information clearinghouse shall collect, collate, and make available a 1 broad range of information on subjects that affect the development, 2 implementation, and operation of diverse fisheries and habitat 3 4 enhancement projects. The information clearinghouse service may include periodical news and informational bulletins; 5

б (ii) An ongoing program in order to provide direct, on-site 7 technical assistance and services to regional fisheries enhancement 8 groups. The advisory board shall assist regional fisheries enhancement 9 groups in soliciting federal, state, and local agencies, tribal governments, institutions of higher education, and private business for 10 the purpose of providing technical assistance and services to regional 11 fisheries enhancement group projects; and 12

(iii) A cost estimate for implementing the plan; 13

14 (c) Propose a budget to the director for operation of the advisory 15 board and implementation of the technical assistance plan;

(d) Make recommendations to the director regarding regional 16 enhancement group project proposals and funding of those proposals; and 17

18 (e) Establish criteria for the redistribution of unspent project 19 funds for any regional enhancement group that has a year ending balance exceeding one hundred thousand dollars. 20

(2) The regional fisheries enhancement group advisory board may: 21

(a) Facilitate resolution of disputes between regional fisheries 22 23 enhancement groups and the department;

24 (b) Promote community and governmental partnerships that enhance 25 the salmon resource and habitat;

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(c) Promote environmental ethics and watershed stewardship;

27 (d) Advocate for watershed management and restoration;

28 (e) Coordinate regional fisheries enhancement group workshops and 29 training;

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(f) Monitor and evaluate regional fisheries enhancement projects; 31 (g) Provide guidance to regional fisheries enhancement groups; and

(h) Develop recommendations to the director to address identified 32 impediments to the success of regional fisheries enhancement groups. 33

34 (3)(a) The regional fisheries enhancement group advisory board shall develop recommendations for limitations on the amount of overhead 35 that a regional fisheries enhancement group may charge from each of the 36 37 following categories of funding provided to the group:

- 38 (i) Federal funds;
- 39 (ii) State funds;

1 (iii) Local funds; and

2 (iv) Private donations. (b) The advisory board shall develop recommendations for 3 4 limitations on the number and salary of paid employees that are employed by a regional fisheries enhancement group. The regional 5 fisheries enhancement group advisory board shall adhere to the founding б 7 principles for regional groups that emphasize the volunteer nature of the groups, maximization of field-related fishery resource benefits, 8 9 and minimization of overhead. (c) The advisory board shall evaluate and make recommendations for 10 the limitation or elimination of commissions, finders fees, or other 11 12 reimbursements to regional fisheries enhancement group employees. (d) The regional fisheries enhancement group advisory board shall 13 14 report to the appropriate legislative committees by January 1, 1999, on 15 the board recommendations for overhead limitations, paid employee limitations, and commission limitations for regional fisheries 16 17 enhancement groups.

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
