AN ACT Relating to investments in education; amending RCW 43.79.460 and 28A.305.235; adding a new section to chapter 43.79 RCW; creating a new section; and recodifying RCW 28A.305.235.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 Sec. 1. RCW 43.79.460 and 1997 c 261 s 1 are each amended to read 6 as follows:

7 (1) The savings incentive account is created in the custody of the 8 state treasurer. The account shall consist of all moneys appropriated 9 to the account by the legislature. The account is subject to the 10 allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW, but no appropriation is 11 required for expenditures from the account.

12 (2) Within the savings incentive account, the state treasurer may 13 create subaccounts to be credited with ((moneys)) incentive savings attributable to individual state agencies, as determined by the office 14 15 of financial management in consultation with the legislative fiscal 16 committees. Moneys deposited in the subaccounts may be expended only 17 on the authorization of the agency's executive head or designee and 18 only for the purpose of one-time expenditures to improve the quality, 19 efficiency, and effectiveness of services to customers of the state,

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1 such as one-time expenditures for employee training, employee 2 incentives, technology improvements, new work processes, or performance 3 measurement. Funds may not be expended from the account to establish 4 new programs or services, expand existing programs or services, or 5 incur ongoing costs that would require future expenditures.

6 (3) For purposes of this section, "incentive savings" means state 7 general fund appropriations that are unspent as of June 30th of a 8 fiscal year, excluding any amounts included in across-the-board 9 reductions under RCW 43.88.110 and excluding unspent appropriations 10 for:

(a) <u>Caseload and enrollment in entitlement programs, except to the</u> extent that an agency has clearly demonstrated that efficiencies have been achieved in the administration of the entitlement program. <u>"Entitlement program," as used in this section, includes programs for</u> which specific sums of money are appropriated for pass-through to third parties or other entities;

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(b) <u>Enrollments</u> in state institutions of higher education $((\tau))$:

18 (c) <u>A</u> specific amount contained in a condition or limitation to an 19 appropriation in the biennial appropriations act, if the agency did not 20 achieve the <u>specific</u> purpose <u>or objective</u> of the condition or 21 limitation((τ))<u>;</u>

22 (d) Debt service on state $obligations((\tau))$; and

23 (e) <u>State retirement system obligations</u>.

24 (4) The office of fiscal management, after consulting with the 25 legislative fiscal committees, shall report to the treasurer the amount 26 of savings incentives achieved. (((4))) By December 1, 1998, and each December 1st thereafter, the office of financial management shall 27 submit a report to the fiscal committees of the legislature on the 28 29 implementation of this section. The report shall (a) evaluate the 30 impact of this section on agency reversions and end-of-biennium 31 expenditure patterns, and (b) itemize agency expenditures from the 32 savings recovery account.

33 **Sec. 2.** RCW 28A.305.235 and 1997 c 261 s 2 are each amended to 34 read as follows:

The education savings account is created in ((the custody of)) the state ((treasurer)) treasury. The account shall consist of all moneys appropriated to the account by the legislature. ((The account is 1 subject to the allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW, but no
2 appropriation is required for expenditures from the account.

Expenditures from the)) (1) Ten percent of legislative 3 4 appropriations to the education savings account shall be distributed as follows: (a) Fifty percent to the distinguished professorship trust 5 fund under RCW 28B.10.868; (b) seventeen percent to the graduate 6 fellowship trust fund under RCW 28B.10.882; and (c) thirty-three 7 8 percent to the college faculty awards trust fund under RCW 28B.50.837. 9 (2) The remaining moneys in the education savings account may be 10 ((authorized solely by the state board of education and)) appropriated solely for $\left(\left(\frac{1}{1}\right)\right)$ <u>(a)</u> common school construction projects that are 11 eligible for funding from the common school construction account, and 12 13 (((2))) (b) technology improvements in the common schools.

14 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. RCW 28A.305.235, as amended by this act, is 15 recodified as a section in chapter 43.79 RCW.

16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. On the effective date of this act, the state 17 treasurer shall transfer ten percent of the unappropriated balance of 18 the education savings account, to be distributed as follows: (1) Fifty 19 percent to the distinguished professorship trust fund under RCW 20 28B.10.868; (2) seventeen percent to the graduate fellowship trust fund 21 under RCW 28B.10.882; and (3) thirty-three percent to the college 22 faculty awards trust fund under RCW 28B.50.837.

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
