BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That before a jointly sponsored bill may be 1 2 dropped into the hopper during this 1997 First Special Session, it must 3 be available to the Secretary of the Senate, in the case of a House 4 bill, and the Chief Clerk, in the case of a Senate bill, for members to sign as cosponsors, and before producing a jointly sponsored bill the 5 Office of the Code Reviser must have received a written request signed 6 by either the Secretary of Senate or the Chief Clerk of the House, and 8 the leader of the caucus whose member is the first sponsor of the bill; 9 and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the legislature shall adjourn Sine Die September 17, 1997.
