1 TO THE HONORABLE WILLIAM J. CLINTON, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED 2 STATES, AND TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE 3 OF REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF 4 THE UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED:

5 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of 6 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully 7 represent and petition as follows:

8 WHEREAS, Some studies have shown that some seriously ill patients 9 may benefit from the medical use of marijuana to relieve symptoms and 10 suffering which accompany cancer chemotherapy, AIDS wasting syndrome, 11 glaucoma, muscle spasms induced by epilepsy and multiple sclerosis, and 12 some forms of intractable pain; and

WHEREAS, Those seriously ill patients should be exempt from criminal prosecution for limited personal possession and use of marijuana, as should physicians who authorize those patients to use marijuana to relieve symptoms and suffering;

NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that Congress pass and the President approve legislation removing marijuana from the list of Schedule I controlled substances and placing it on the Schedule II list of controlled substances.
