By House Committee on Natural Resources (originally sponsored by Representatives Buck, Regala and Chandler; by request of Department of Fish and Wildlife)

- 1 AN ACT Relating to vehicle use on department of fish and wildlife
- 2 lands; amending RCW 77.32.380 and 77.12.170; prescribing penalties; and
- 3 providing an effective date.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 77.32.380 and 1993 sp.s. c 2 s 77 are each amended to 6 read as follows:
- 7 (1) Persons ((sixteen years of age or older)) who enter upon or use
- 8 clearly identified department ((lands and)) improved access facilities
- 9 ((are)) with a motor vehicle may be required to ((possess a
- 10 conservation license or a hunting, fishing, trapping, or free license
- 11 on their person while using the facilities)) display a current annual
- 12 <u>fish and wildlife lands vehicle use permit on the motor vehicle while</u>
- 13 within or while using an improved access facility. An "improved access
- 14 <u>facility</u>" is a clearly identified area specifically created for motor
- 15 <u>vehicle parking</u>, and includes any boat launch or boat ramp associated
- 16 with the parking area, but does not include the department parking
- 17 <u>facilities at the Gorge Concert Center near George, Washington. The</u>
- 18 <u>vehicle use permit is issued in the form of a decal. One decal shall</u>
- 19 be issued at no charge with each annual saltwater, freshwater,

- 1 combination, small game hunting, big game hunting, and trapping license
- 2 <u>issued by the department</u>. The <u>annual</u> fee for ((this license)) <u>a fish</u>
- 3 <u>and wildlife lands vehicle use permit, if purchased separately,</u> is ten
- 4 dollars ((annually)). A person to whom the department has issued a
- 5 <u>decal or who has purchased a vehicle use permit separately may purchase</u>
- 6 <u>a decal from the department for each additional vehicle owned by the</u>
- 7 person at a cost of five dollars per decal upon a showing of proof to
- 8 the department that the person owns the additional vehicle or vehicles.
- 9 Revenue derived from the sale of fish and wildlife lands vehicle use
- 10 permits shall be used solely for the stewardship and maintenance of
- 11 department improved access facilities. Revenue derived from the sale
- 12 of fish and wildlife lands vehicle use permits shall be used solely for
- 13 the stewardship and maintenance of department improved access
- 14 facilities.
- 15 ((The spouse, all children under eighteen years of age, and guests
- 16 under eighteen years of age of the holder of a valid conservation
- 17 license may use department lands and access facilities when accompanied
- 18 by the license holder.))
- 19 Youth groups may use department ((<del>lands and game</del>)) <u>improved</u> access
- 20 facilities without possessing a ((conservation license)) vehicle use
- 21 permit when accompanied by a ((license)) vehicle use permit holder.
- 22 The department may accept contributions into the state wildlife
- 23 <u>fund for the sound stewardship of fish and wildlife.</u> Contributors
- 24 shall be known as "conservation patrons" and, for contributions of
- 25 twenty dollars or more, shall receive a fish and wildlife lands vehicle
- 26 <u>use permit free of charge.</u>
- 27 ((The conservation license is nontransferable and must be validated
- 28 by the signature of the holder. Upon request of a wildlife agent or ex
- 29 officio wildlife agent a person using clearly identified department
- 30 lands shall exhibit the required license.))
- 31 (2) The decal must be affixed in a permanent manner to the motor
- 32 <u>vehicle before entering upon or using the motor vehicle on a department</u>
- 33 improved access facility, and must be displayed on the rear window of
- 34 the motor vehicle, or, if the motor vehicle does not have a rear
- 35 window, on the rear of the motor vehicle.
- 36 (3) Failure to display the fish and wildlife lands vehicle use
- 37 permit if required by this section is an infraction under chapter 7.84
- 38 RCW, and department employees are authorized to issue a notice of
- 39 infraction to the registered owner of any motor vehicle entering upon

- 1 or using a department improved access facility without such a decal.
- 2 The penalty for failure to display or improper display of the decal is
- 3 <u>sixty-six dollars.</u>
- 4 **Sec. 2.** RCW 77.12.170 and 1996 c 101 s 7 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) There is established in the state treasury the state wildlife 7 fund which consists of moneys received from:
- 8 (a) Rentals or concessions of the department;
- 9 (b) The sale of real or personal property held for department 10 purposes;
- 11 (c) The sale of licenses, permits, tags, stamps, and punchcards 12 required by this title;
- 13 (d) Fees for informational materials published by the department;
- 14 (e) Fees for personalized vehicle license plates as provided in 15 chapter 46.16 RCW;
- 16 (f) Articles or wildlife sold by the director under this title;
- 17 (g) Compensation for wildlife losses or <u>contributions</u>, gifts, or 18 grants received under RCW 77.12.320 <u>or 77.32.380</u>;
- 19 (h) Excise tax on anadromous game fish collected under chapter 20 82.27 RCW;
- 21 (i) The sale of personal property seized by the department for 22 wildlife violations; and
- 23 (j) The department's share of revenues from auctions and raffles 24 authorized by the commission.
- 25 (2) State and county officers receiving any moneys listed in 26 subsection (1) of this section shall deposit them in the state treasury 27 to be credited to the state wildlife fund.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. This act takes effect January 1, 1999.
