1 AN ACT Relating to accident reports; amending RCW 46.52.030; and 2 declaring an emergency.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **sec. 1.** RCW 46.52.030 and 1996 c 183 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

6 (1) Unless a report is to be made by a law enforcement officer 7 under subsection (3) of this section, the driver of any vehicle involved in an accident resulting in injury to or death of any person 8 9 or damage to the property of any one person to an apparent extent equal 10 to or greater than the minimum amount established by rule adopted by the chief of the Washington state patrol in accordance with subsection 11 (5) of this section, shall, within ((twenty-four hours)) four days 12 13 after such accident, make a written report of such accident to the 14 chief of police of the city or town if such accident occurred within an 15 incorporated city or town or the county sheriff or state patrol if such accident occurred outside incorporated cities and towns. 16 Nothing in 17 this subsection prohibits accident reports from being filed by drivers where damage to property is less than the minimum amount or where a law 18 enforcement officer has submitted a report. 19

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1 (2) The original of the report shall be immediately forwarded by 2 the authority receiving the report to the chief of the Washington state 3 patrol at Olympia, Washington. The Washington state patrol shall give 4 the department of licensing full access to the report.

5 (3) Any law enforcement officer who investigates an accident for 6 which a ((driver's)) report is required under subsection (1) of this 7 section shall submit an investigator's report as required by RCW 8 46.52.070.

9 (4) The chief of the Washington state patrol may require any driver of any vehicle involved in an accident, of which report must be made as 10 provided in this section, to file supplemental reports whenever the 11 original report in ((his)) the chief's opinion is insufficient, and may 12 13 likewise require witnesses of any such accident to render reports. For this purpose, the chief of the Washington state patrol shall prepare 14 15 and, upon request, supply to any police department, coroner, sheriff, 16 and any other suitable agency or individual, sample forms of accident 17 reports required hereunder, which reports shall be upon a form devised by the chief of the Washington state patrol and shall call for 18 19 sufficiently detailed information to disclose all material facts with 20 reference to the accident to be reported thereon, including the location, the ((cause)) circumstances, the conditions then existing, 21 the persons and vehicles involved, the insurance information required 22 under RCW 46.30.030, personal injury or death, if any, the amounts of 23 24 property damage claimed, the total number of vehicles involved, whether 25 the vehicles were legally parked, legally standing, or moving, and 26 whether such vehicles were occupied at the time of the accident. Every 27 required accident report shall be made on a form prescribed by the chief of the Washington state patrol and each authority charged with 28 29 the duty of receiving such reports shall provide sufficient report 30 forms in compliance with the form devised. The report forms shall be 31 designated so as to provide that a copy may be retained by the 32 reporting person.

(5) The chief of the Washington state patrol shall adopt rules establishing the accident-reporting threshold for property damage accidents. Beginning October 1, 1987, the accident-reporting threshold for property damage accidents shall be five hundred dollars. The accident-reporting threshold for property damage accidents shall be revised when necessary, but not more frequently than every two years. The revisions shall only be for the purpose of recognizing economic

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changes as reflected by an inflationary index recommended by the office
of financial management. The revisions shall be guided by the change
in the index for the time period since the last revision.

4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. This act is necessary for the immediate 5 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the 6 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect 7 immediately.
