1 AN ACT Relating to creating the education technology revolving
2 fund; amending RCW 28D.02.060; adding a new section to chapter 28D.02
3 RCW; and declaring an emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 28D.02 RCW
6 to read as follows:

7 (1) The education technology revolving fund is created in the
8 custody of the state treasurer. All receipts from billings under
9 subsection (2) of this section must be deposited in the revolving fund.
10 Only the director of the department of information services or the
11 director's designee may authorize expenditures from the fund. The
12 revolving fund shall be used only to pay for the acquisition of
13 equipment, software, supplies, and services, and other costs incidental
14 to the acquisition, development, operation, and administration of
15 shared educational information technology services, telecommunications,
16 and systems. The revolving fund shall not be used for the acquisition,
17 maintenance, or operations of local networks or on-premises equipment
18 specific to a particular institution or group of institutions.

1 (2) The revolving fund and all disbursements from the revolving
2 fund are subject to the allotment procedure under chapter 43.88 RCW,
3 but an appropriation is not required for expenditures. The department
4 of information services shall, in consultation with entities connected
5 to the network under RCW 28D.02.070 and subject to the review and
6 approval of the office financial management, establish and implement a
7 billing structure to assure that all network users pay an equitable
8 share of the costs in relation to their usage of the network.

9 **Sec. 2.** RCW 28D.02.060 and 1996 c 137 s 7 are each amended to read
10 as follows:

11 The K-20 technology account is hereby created in the state
12 treasury. The department of information services shall deposit into
13 the account ((all)) moneys received from legislative appropriations,
14 gifts, grants, and endowments for the K-20 telecommunication system.
15 The account shall be subject to appropriation and may be expended
16 solely for the K-20 telecommunication system approved by the committee
17 under RCW 28D.02.010. Disbursements from the account shall be on
18 authorization of the director of the department of information services
19 with approval of the committee under RCW 28D.02.010.

20 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** This act is necessary for the immediate
21 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
22 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
23 immediately.
