3 On page 7, beginning on line 11 of the amendment strike all of
4 section 205 and section 206 and insert the following:

5 **"NEW SECTION. Sec. 205. FOR THE LEGISLATIVE TRANSPORTATION**
6 **COMMITTEE**

7 Motor Vehicle Account--State Appropriation \$ 7,095,000

8 The appropriation in this section is subject to the following
9 conditions and limitations and specified amounts are provided solely
10 for that activity:

11 (1) \$2,306,000 Of the motor vehicle account--state appropriation
12 is provided for the operation of the Senate transportation committee.
13 The appropriation includes \$500,000 for personal service contracts and
14 other activites as deemed necessary by the Senate transportation
15 committee.

16 (2) \$2,267,000 Of the motor vehicle account--state appropriation
17 is provided for the operation of the House of Representatives
18 transportation committee. The appropriation includes \$500,000 for
19 personal service contracts and other activities as deemed necessary by
20 the House of Representatives transportation committee.

21 (3) The senate transportation committee shall work during the 1999
22 interim with members of the senate ways and means committee to assess
23 funding options for aviation.

24 (4) The transportation committees of the legislature shall
25 evaluate the transportation functions currently performed by the
26 utilities and transportation commission including but not limited to
27 those regarding the issuance of certificates of public convenience and
28 necessity for auto transportation companies.

29 (5) A legislative task force consisting of one member from each
30 caucus of the senate and one member from each caucus of the house of
31 representatives shall conduct a road jurisdiction study. The
32 legislative task force shall appoint a technical advisory panel
33 consisting of representatives of cities, counties, and the department

1 of transportation. The study shall include but not be limited to an
2 examination of the following issues:

3 (a) Whether changed conditions merit redesignation of certain
4 local roadways as state routes and the return of certain state routes
5 to local jurisdictions;

6 (b) Alternatives to current revenue distribution methodologies for
7 funding roadway and highway needs;

8 (c) Determine roadway responsibilities, authorities, and practices
9 by jurisdictional level; and

10 (d) Evaluate governance issues associated with road jurisdiction.

11 (6) The transportation committees of the legislature shall oversee
12 program accountability reviews of department of transportation,
13 department of licensing, and Washington state patrol programs selected
14 by the senate transportation committee."

15 Renumber remaining sections and correct internal references
16 accordingly.
