17 **Sec. 915.** RCW 43.08.250 and 1997 c 149 s 910 are each amended to
18 read as follows:

19 The money received by the state treasurer from fees, fines,
20 forfeitures, penalties, reimbursements or assessments by any court
21 organized under Title 3 or 35 RCW, or chapter 2.08 RCW, shall be
22 deposited in the public safety and education account which is hereby
23 created in the state treasury. The legislature shall appropriate the
24 funds in the account to promote traffic safety education, highway
25 safety, criminal justice training, crime victims' compensation,
26 judicial education, the judicial information system, civil
27 representation of indigent persons, winter recreation parking, and
28 state game programs. During the fiscal biennium ending June 30,
29 ((1999)) 2001, the legislature may appropriate moneys from the public
30 safety and education account for purposes of appellate indigent defense
31 and other operations of the office of public defense, the criminal

1 litigation unit of the attorney general's office, the supervision
2 management and recidivist tracking program, the treatment alternatives
3 to street crimes program, crime victims advocacy programs, justice
4 information network telecommunication planning, sexual assault
5 treatment, operations of the office of administrator for the courts,
6 security in the common schools, alternative school start-up grants,
7 programs for disruptive students, criminal justice data collection,
8 ((and)) Washington state patrol criminal justice activities, and the
9 replacement of the department of corrections' offender-based tracking
10 system.-

EFFECT: Provides public safety and education account funding to and requires the Office of the Attorney General to implement the supervision management and recidivist tracking (SMART) program on a statewide basis. Reduces the public safety and education account funding to the Department of Corrections for the purpose of the replacement of the offender-based tracking system by \$800,000. Amends state statute relating to the public safety and education account to accommodate the SMART program for the 1999-01 biennium.

FISCAL IMPACT: None.
