<u>EFFECT OF HOUSE AMENDMENT:</u> (1) Permits naturopaths to examine a wrestling, kickboxing, boxing, or martial arts participant 24 hours before a fight, monitor fights, and perform physicals prior to licensing.

(2) Retains the department of licensing's authority to hire inspectors and preserves their duties in statute.

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
