3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 601.** A new section is added to 1999 sp.s. c 1  
4 (uncodified) to read as follows:

5 **DONATIONS OF EMPLOYEE LEAVE.** During the 1999-2001 fiscal biennium,  
6 a state employee may, consistent with the provisions of RCW  
7 41.04.665(3), donate leave to the existing leave balances of an  
8 employee who dies in the line of duty between February 1, 2000, and  
9 June 30, 2001. The value of the donated leave will be included in the  
10 deceased employee's final compensation, but is not compensation  
11 earnable for the purposes of chapter 41.40 RCW. The agency head shall  
12 determine the total amount of leave that may be donated under this  
13 section. The Washington personnel resources board may adopt rules, in  
14 consultation with the office of financial management, as it deems  
15 necessary for the implementation of this temporary benefit.

16 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 602.** The following bills, as identified by bill  
17 number, in the form passed by the legislature are necessary to  
18 implement portions of this act: House Bill Nos. 2788, 2917, 2866,

20 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 603.** If any provision of this act or its  
21 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the  
22 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other  
23 persons or circumstances is not affected.

24 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 604.** This act is necessary for the immediate  
25 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the  
26 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect  
27 immediately.
