Prostate cancer is the most common cancer (excluding skin cancer) of American men. In 1998 about 185,000 new cases of prostate cancer will be diagnosed in the United States. Prostate cancer is the second leading cause of cancer death in men, exceeded only by lung cancer. Thirty-nine thousand men in the United States are projected to die of this disease during 1999. African-American men have the highest incidence of prostate cancer of any population of men in the world today.
