The AmericanCancerSocietyecommends mammogram screeningveryone to two years for women between theage of 40 and 49, withannualscreeningftethat They also recommend that Women 18 years and oldershould have a Paptestand pelviexam everyyear. The average cost of screenings \$200 perpatient.

Currently hestatedoes not have a non-Medicaid rogram for screening ow income women between the ages of 40 and 49 for breast and cervical ancer.

SUMMARY: The Department of Health is required odevelops program formaking breast and cervical ancers creening vailable low income women between the ages of 40 and 49. The department is required odefind ow income and administ the program with no more than ten percent of the total propriation the department is also required breport to the Legislature December 1, 2000, and annually hereaften the department add ministrative penditures county administrative penses expenses for directervice and the number of women served by the program.
