BACKGROUND: The state ong-Term Care Ombudsman Programwas established derfederal and state aw. The state was required complywith federal aw. Until 989, the ombudsman programwas contained within the Department of Social and Health Service (DSHS) and used few volunteer budsman. State statute (RCW 43.190.060) prohibited blunteer from investigation model aints.

In1989, theombudsman programwas removed from the DSHS and housed in a private on-profit rganization organizations directed brecruism dtrail ocal olunte combudsmen in order to increase the presence of ombudsmen in long-termare (LTC) facilities 1992, federallaw (42U.S.C.ú 3058g) was amended to express layay that local olunte combudsmen shall investigate mplaints oncerning the residents LTC facilities shall perform ther duties including for mingesidents their ights.

Volunteermbudsmen arecurrentlinvestigations plaints oncerning heresidents of LTC facilities performing the appropriate attending forming esidents of their ights. However, although ederal awallows his surrent ractice on forming hanges instated aware needed in order for volunteers continute oconduct the seconductions.

Volunteermbudsmen visiffacilitima weeklybasisandprovida communitypresenceinthe facilityastyeartheombudsman programhandledver4,000complaintstatewideOne-third involvedesidentsightwiolationsnotherthirdoncernedpoorcare. Over 93 percentofall complaintsere resolvedwithonlysevenpercentofthecomplaintseferredblawenforcement ora licensimgregulatoragency.

The use of non-nursingome long-termservice has grown steadilynthe past three years.

During this period ftime boarding omes have realized 22 percent growthin licensededs.
