• Requires any city or town that establishes a new municipal court to report the creation of the court to the supreme court within 30 days.

Background:

Some municipal courts operate as departments of the county district courts. Cities and towns, however, are also authorized to create their own municipal courts that operate independently of the district courts. Municipal courts have jurisdiction over civil and criminal matters arising out of municipal ordinances.

House Bill Report - 1 - HB 2772

Summary of Substitute Bill:

Whenever a city or town creates a municipal court, notice of the establishment of the court must be sent to the supreme court within 30 days.

Substitute Bill Compared to Original Bill: The substitute bill corrects a drafting error by replacing the word "county" with the word "town."

Appropriation: None.

Fiscal Note: Not requested.

Effective Date of Substitute Bill: Ninety days after adjournment of session in which bill is passed.

Testimony For: There is currently no official way to keep track of newly created courts.

Testimony Against: None.
